How do I get a library card?

A parent/guardian must fill out the enclosed Library Membership Form and sign the back. Bring it in to your teacher to give to the library.

Or you can call in to the library during the summer with your filled in membership form and proof of address. Then you will receive your library card straight away.

Do I have to pay to join?

No it is **FREE** to join. You only pay for printing, photocopying, and charges/fines on overdue or lost books.

What can I borrow?

12 items for three weeks.



What if my books are late?

A fine of 5c per item per day for late books applies — give the library your email address & you will get a reminder email three days before books are due back.

Can I use the internet?

Parent/guardian must sign a consent form in the library for children and Under 16s. Under 12s on internet must be accompanied at

Can I keep my books for longer?

If nobody else is looking for the books you can keep them for longer by

1. Ringing 045 891740
2. Calling into the library
3. Renewing your books through the library website—click on 'Online Catalogue' and then go into your account

How do I access my account?

You need to enter the long library card number which is on your library card and the pin which is the last four digits of the library card number.

What help can I get with my school projects?

You can call into the library and ask the librarian to direct you to useful books.
