I visited the house of Mrs Catherine Cunniam to-day, with whom the two Duffy children are boarded out. I am not satisfied with the general conditions of the house, and the care and up-bringing of the children. The school attendance of the Duffy children is irregular, and they are both very backward in their education. The house is quite two miles distant from the school, which is a long distance for young children to have to walk in wet and inclement weather. Mrs Cunniam was very rude to me to-day when I visited her hous house. She is the only person in the whole of Rathdrum Union who objected to my inspection. Since visiting the house I have learned from the Relieving Officer that Mrs Cunniam's husband is a Guardian. He is therefore not eligible to have the custody of Boarded Out children from the Union. I would strongly recommend that theses two children should be removed to another foster home, and one which is situated nearer to a school. The children should be sent to school regularly, especially as they are so backward in education. Mrs cunniam does not appear to have any affection for the children, and said they were "no use to her". I have instructed Mr Byrne R O to interview Mrs Cunniam and to tell her that I wish the children to be removed to a home situated nearer to a school. The boy Michael Higgins, at present boarded out with John Byrne, of Knockrath, has been attending school irregularly of late. Mr Byrne having kept him at home to work. I believe it is Mr Byrne!s intention not to keep the boy during the winter months, as he says he has no work for him during the winter. The following Letters and other Communications were read by the Clerk, and orders were made or them respectively, as follows :-

Read report dated November 21st, 1914, from Dr Lynch, Medical officer, Newcastle Dispensary District, stating that he had found it necessary to requisition the services of Dr Eccles, Delgany, to administer an anaesthetic and assist him in a critical midwifery case in Kilcool, the patient being Mrs Ovington. It was subsequently necessary to have the patient removed to Holles Street Lying In Hospital for special treatment. The case occurred at about 2 a.m. on the previous mur sday.

Read letter from same, dated November 20th, 1914, and addressed to Relieving Officer Murphy, informing him that he had attended Mrs ovington in her confinement on the previous day. It was necessary, Dr Lynch stated, that she should be sent in to Holles Street Hospital early on the following day. She could not go in a cab or by train and he asked the Relieving Officer to give him authority to 'phone for a taxi. In his opinion this was the only course to be taken in order to save her life. Sending her to Rathdrum in the ambulance would be out of the question.

Read further letter from same, dated November 21st, 1914, and also addressed Relieving Officer Murphy, stating that the patient, Mrs Ovington had been conveyed to Holles Street Lying In Hospital that afternoon in a motor from Greystones. He enclosed the bill for same. In his opinion, and that of Dr Eccles who met him in consultation, it was absolutely necessary that she should be removed to Holles St. for osecial treatment. If he had sent her to Rathdrum in the usual way he believed her life would have been seriously endangered.
