FUNDING OF €243,000 ALLOCATED TO WICKLOW COUNTY COUNCIL FOR COASTAL EROSION RISK MANAGEMENT STUDIES FROM BRITTAS BAY TO CLOGGA BEACH

Wicklow County Council has been approved funding of €243,000 by the Office of Public Works in order to conduct two Coastal Erosion Risk Management Studies under the Minor Flood Mitigation Works and Coastal Protection Scheme, covering from the start of Brittas Bay to the County Wexford boundary.

The first study includes Brittas Bay and Ennereilly Beach where Malachy Walsh and Co. LTD have been appointed to complete the study. This will include a 12km stretch of an area designated as a Special Area of conversation and a Proposed Natural Heritage Area.

The second study includes Arklow North Beach, Porters Rock Beach, Arklow South Beach and Clogga Strand Beach, where RPS Ireland Ltd have been appointed. The total length of this study area is over 10km and includes Proposed Natural Heritage Areas and rock revetments.

The aim of these studies are to undertake a detailed coastal erosion risk management investigation to develop an appropriate plan to best manage the risks identified to human health and life (social), the environment, cultural heritage and economic activity and to further assess and investigate the feasibility of the management plan. The study will provide information on erosion patterns and will include a condition survey of all coastal protection structures.

€15,000 AWARDED TO TWO RECIPIENTS OF THE WICKLOW SHORT FILM AWARD FOR 2024

Screen Wicklow and Wicklow County Arts Office, supported by Creative Ireland, are delighted to announce the recipients of the Wicklow Short Film Award for 2024. The two funding awards of €15,000 each form part of the ongoing support provided to the local screen sector by Wicklow County Council. The scheme was launched by Wicklow County Council on the 8th April with a closing date for applications on 24th May.

Following a highly competitive application process, with many high-quality submissions received, the two short film projects selected by the independent adjudication panel were:

Dealing With It - Submitted by Santiago Rivas Pertile

Sapphire - Submitted by Michael J. Whelan

The award will act as a steppingstone in the careers of Wicklow-based film-makers and will support greater recognition of the vibrant independent film-making tradition in the county.

These short films will be between 10 and 15 minutes in duration and will feature Wicklow locations. Upon completion, the short films will be entered into local and international film festivals, further boosting the strong international reputation of County Wicklow as a prime location for film and television production.

Availability of contractors to carry out re-let refurbishment work continues to be the major limiting factor in turning around Voids/Re-lets. The Council can only recoup a maximum of €11,000 per house from the Dept of Housing Local Government and Heritage, whereas the average cost of relets was €36,000 per house in 2022 and €31,000 per house in 2023.

The overall vacancy rate for rental properties (private and social) on Census night was 7%, so our vacancy rate is less than half the overall rate for a rental sector where Local Authorities account for only 29.8% of the properties. Also, Wicklow County Council's vacant units only account for 3.2% of the total number of vacant units in our county.

Housing Maintenance

Planned Maintenance in the form of electrical remedial works is currently nearing completion at Parkmore in Baltinglass. Protech Electrical will then be moving on to Palladius Park in Donard.

Gas boiler maintenance Framework Agreements have been tendered on <u>www.supplygov.ie</u> for Baltinglass, Wicklow and Greystones MDs. Gaswise were successful tenderers for Greystones and Wicklow MDs and will start servicing on 29th of July. Bracken Plumbing & Heating were successful tenderers for the Baltinglass MD and have started gas servicing in addition to oil boiler servicing already underway in that MD. Heat Pump maintenance contract documents are currently being prepared.

Private Rented Accommodation Regulation & Enforcement

The Targeted Inspection programme on private rented accommodation continues. Housing For All requires 25% of all private rented properties to be inspected annually. This equates to approx. 1500 properties in Co. Wicklow every year. Target properties are selected using a Risk Based approach. The Council is responsible for enforcing the Housing (Standards for Rented Houses) Regulations 2019 (SI 137 of 2019). So far in 2024, the following Notices have been served by Wicklow County Council in relation to breaches of SI 137 of 2019:

Capital Assistance Scheme (CAS)

Homeless HAP Place Finder

The Homeless HAP Place finder provides assistance in:

- Seeking out potential properties suitable for households currently identified as homeless or at risk of homelessness.
- > Liaising with specific households to establish their specific needs.
- > Establishing relationships with local property agents and landlords; and,
- Supporting those homeless households to (a) prevent the necessity to enter emergency accommodation or (b) to exit emergency accommodation and secure a tenancy.
- To date, 562 households (387 families & 168 singles) have been assisted under the Homeless HAP Scheme in Wicklow County Council from the inception on 1st October 2018 to 30th June 2024. (225 homeless cases, 313 prevention cases to date and 23 direct provision). 141 properties were sourced by WCC.

Addressing Homelessness in Partnership with Approved Housing Bodie

Homeless Supported Temporary Accommodation - Kilmantin Hill, Wicklow

Kilmantin Hill has 11 rooms to support persons either homeless, exiting a higher support facility, or in danger of becoming homeless.

There are 9 clients supported in the Kilmantin Hill facility, operated by Dublin Simon. There is continuous transition by the clients to suitable alternative accommodation.

A report is being undertaken at present to cost the refurbishment of the current rooms with a view to making them all ensuite. More details will be available over the coming months.

Homeless Family Service – Fitzwilliam Road, Wicklow

Dublin Simon are engaged by Wicklow County Council to operate and manage the facility at Fitzwilliam Road, Wicklow as a Family Homeless Service. The building comprises of three 1-bed units, two 2-bed units, and two 3-bed units. Eleven families have now transitioned or are in the process of transitioning to a permanent home and the resulting vacancies are in the process of being occupied with families experiencing or in danger of homelessness.

It is envisaged that families will avail of the service for circa 6-months STA (Supported Temporary Accommodation) with key working support to enable families to transition from homelessness into Homeless HAP, or alternative longer-term accommodation.

Homeless Supported Temporary Accommodation - San Remo, Bray

San Remo is operated by Dublin Simon and incorporates a service model whereby there are a number of emergency/cold weather initiative beds and Supported Temporary Accommodation Beds (STA). There is on site key working support linking in with clients.

The Neighbourhood Liaison Committee is now operational and meets monthly.

Bi-monthly meetings are held with Dublin Simon and Wicklow County Council staff.

Homeless Supported Accommodation - Carraig Eden, Greystones

This facility provides 35 ensuite bedrooms with associated kitchens and common areas and is fully operational. Wicklow County Council run an in-reach service with the clients to support them as they continue their journey into more permanent accommodation.

Other Homeless Supported Accommodation

Wicklow County Council owned properties in Wicklow, Bray, and Greystones, leased to Approved Housing Bodies, provide 12 units of low to medium supported accommodation targeted to the particular support needs of the clients. Six of these persons living in shared accommodation have now successfully moved into their forever homes and this in turn created space to move further people out of homelessness.

A homeless outreach service has been rolled out in Bray and is proving very successful.

Housing First

Peter McVerry Trust has been appointed as the Housing First Programme Implementer for the Mid-East Region. Wicklow County Council is committed to working with them and has now reached and surpassed the targets identified in the programme. Housing First recognises that a stable home provides the basis for recovery in other areas.

Properties will be provided by both Wicklow County Council and Peter McVerry Trust for the implementation of the programme.

Wicklow County Council has, to date, successfully accommodated 18 clients under Housing First. Other clients proposed for Housing First have been assessed by the team and are availing of key support work pending finalisation of sourcing of accommodation. The main issue facing this programme is the availability of 1-bed units in suitable locations with easy access to required services.

Homeless Action Plan 2024 – 2026

The plan was approved by the elected members of Wicklow County Council at the Council meeting on 8th April 2024.

Ukrainian Response

As of the end of June 2024, there are 1,690 Ukrainian displaced persons in emergency accommodation, although it is known that there are significantly more in the county.

The breakdown of Beneficiaries of Temporary Protection is as follows:

- Arklow MD: 221
- Baltinglass MD: 351
- Bray MD: 756
- Greystones MD: 178
- Wicklow MD: 184

Wicklow County Council is currently assessing all displaced Ukrainians in the county to determine their accommodation needs and to connect them with relevant community services and supports.

Wicklow County Council is also working through a list of pledged properties within the county to match families with appropriate housing. To date, Wicklow County Council has housed 276 displaced Ukrainian individuals in pledged stand-alone 'Offer a Home' properties within the county.

Additionally, larger buildings and vacant units are being identified and explored as potential medium to long-term accommodation options.

Community Recognition Fund (CRF) 2024

The Minister for Rural & Community Development, Heather Humphreys TD, together with her colleague Minister Joe O'Brien TD, have announced a further €50 million in national funding under the Community Recognition Fund to deliver projects over 2025 and 2026.

The Community Recognition Fund was first introduced last year to recognise the huge efforts made by communities in welcoming and supporting people coming to Ireland.

Wicklow County Council has been allocated €1,584,550 under the 2024 Community Recognition Fund.

The Community Recognition Fund 2024 aims to support the development of community infrastructure and facilities for the entire community, in recognition of the contribution being made by communities across the country in welcoming and hosting significant numbers of arrivals from Ukraine and other countries.

The scheme details set out that only areas which have high levels of new arrivals will be deemed eligible for this scheme.

Wicklow County Council sought expressions of interest for project proposals from community groups in areas where large numbers of citizens from other countries are currently living. Projects to be funded will be capital in nature, deliver medium to long term benefits for the communities in which they are located, and be capable of being delivered over the course of 2025 to 2026.

An information session was held online on 18th April 2024 at 5.30pm, with approximately 35 groups joining this online session.

Pride of Place 2024

The Co-Operation Ireland Pride of Place Competition 2024 opened for nominations in May 2024. The purpose of the competition is to acknowledge the work being done every day by communities all over Ireland.

Over two days at the end of August, each entrant will have the opportunity to make a full presentation on their category to the Pride of Place Judges Panel.

The winners of the National Pride of Place Competition will be announced at an Awards Ceremony in Monaghan on Saturday 2nd November 2024.

Local Community Safety Partnerships (LCSPs)

Appointment of Chairperson to the new Local Community Safety Partnership for the County of Wicklow

Wicklow County Council recently invited expressions of interest for consideration to the appointment as Chairperson of the new Local Community Safety Partnerships (LCSPs) which will be established in each Local Authority area in line with the Policing, Security and Community Safety Act 2024.

The Chairperson will be responsible for the leadership of the LCSP and ensuring its effectiveness on all aspects of its role. They will also lead the work of the Local Community Safety Partnership and the Community Safety Coordinator and Administrator.

The new Local Community Safety Partnerships will bring all services and the community together at local authority level, replacing the existing Joint Policing Committees, to serve as a forum for discussion and decisions on community priorities.

Local Community Safety Partnership (LCSP) gives local people a stronger voice to identify and tackle community safety issues.

The closing date for receipt of expressions of interest was Monday 15th July 2024. Expressions of Interest may be shortlisted, and interviews held where deemed necessary in the coming months.

Launch of LEADER Programme 2023 - 2027

The LEADER programme for 2023 – 2027 was officially launched on at an event held by County Wicklow Partnership in Ballybeg House, Tinahely on Thursday 19th June. The programme is managed by the County Wicklow Partnership for Wicklow LCDC and aims to improve the quality of life and encourage diversification of economic activity in rural areas. It seeks to bring about positive change helping to support and sustain rural areas for the better. It is anticipated that the first funding applications under the new LEADER programme will be considered by the LCDC at their July 2024 meeting.

CLÁR 2024

Almost €9 million in fresh funding has been allocated to community and sports facilities nationwide under the 2024 CLÁR (Ceantair Laga Árd-Riachtanais) programme.

The CLÁR programme provides funding for small scale projects in rural areas that have experienced significant levels of population decline.

The programme is divided into three measures, which cover the different initiatives supported by the scheme.

Under **Measure 1** of the 2024 initiative, grants from €5,000 to €50,000 are being provided to support the development of community and sports facilities, youth clubs, playgrounds, sensory gardens, walking tracks and much more.

Measure 2 supports voluntary groups that provide free transport to people receiving cancer care and other treatment as well as Community First Response Support and Search and Rescue organisations. This year organisations providing a meals on wheels service are eligible to apply. The measure comes with maximum grants of €50,000 for a car and €100,000 for a bus.

Measure 3 is designed to support offshore island communities, with maximum grants of €120,000 available for community transport projects and up to €50,000 available for amenities projects.

Applications for Measures 1 & 3 closed on 19th June, and Measure 2 on 5th June.

Measure 1 is administered by Local Authorities in consultation with local communities and applications will only be accepted directly from Local Authorities. Measure 2 and Measure 3 are administered directly by the Department of Rural and Community Development.

Areas targeted under the CLÁR Programme are parts of counties: Carlow, Cavan, Clare, Cork, Donegal, Galway, Kerry, Kilkenny, Laois, Limerick, Longford, Louth, Mayo, Meath, Monaghan, Offaly, Roscommon, Sligo, Tipperary, and Waterford, Westmeath, Wicklow and all of County Leitrim.

Under the 2024 CLAR scheme, Wicklow has submitted 6 applications for projects in Annacurragh, Ballinacor, Askanagap and Knockananna at a cost of €283,742, seeking grant aid of €241,783

Community Awards Scheme 2024

As part of its commitment to supporting local community development, Wicklow County Council operates an annual Community Award Scheme. The fund for 2024 is available as grant aid to successful community groups and local organisations wishing to undertake community projects in their area. There is a maximum grant amount of €500 per organisation for small projects and group running costs. Application assessments have been completed, and applicants have been notified directly. Arrangements are currently being made to pay the successful applicants.

Local Enhancement Programme 2024

The Local Enhancement Programme 2024 was launched in December 2023 by Minister for Rural and Community Development and Minister of State with Responsibility for Community Development and Charities. €176,338.11 was allocated to Wicklow County Council, €29,389.69 of which has been reserved for Women's groups in recognition of the fact that there is a growing number of Women's Sheds, Groups, and Networks across the country. The funding will provide capital supports essential for the many small community groups and organisations, particularly those who serve disadvantaged areas in rural and urban areas.

An Taoiseach Simon Harris announced the successful projects in Co. Wicklow on 21st May 2024, at an Awards Ceremony held in the Tramway Theatre, Blessington. Payments are currently under way to the successful applicants. 173 groups from across the County benefitted under the general scheme, and an additional 27 groups benefitted under the ring-fenced Women's allocation.

Action 3.8 Appoint Healthy Age Friendly Homes Co-ordinator & Rollout Wicklow Programme

Healthy Age Friendly Homes (HAFH) Programme is a support coordination programme that aims to enable older people to age in place and reduce the need to transfer to long-term residential care. The Programme is a collaboration between the Department of Health and the Department of Housing and Local Government. It is funded by the Department of Health and operated by Meath County Council, on behalf of all Local Authorities.

The service is designed to enable older people to remain living in their own home for longer. The local coordinator undertakes home visits to older people living in the community, where a needs assessment is carried out, looking at four key areas of supports: housing, health, community/social supports, and technology. Home visits from the local co-coordinator are available to anyone aged 65+years. The rollout of the programme commenced in January 2024 and is going from strength to strength.

Older People's Council, Executive Group - Meetings and Representation

The Older People's Council (OPC) meets regularly and at the last meeting in June 2024, the items covered were: Over 70's driving licences, Travel and Health Insurance, Transportation and G.P. Appointments. The next meeting will be held in September 2024.

OPC Executive is planning for wider engagement with older people across the county and recruitment of more members of the OPC this year.

County Wicklow Age Friendly Alliance

The County Wicklow Age Friendly Alliance meets on a regular basis and at the most recent meeting in June, the following issues were discussed: Health, Transport, Housing and Socialisation. Each member of the Older Persons Council discussed the issues facing their own areas. Visits were carried out to various clubs around the county for example Men's Sheds, Women's Sheds and Active Retirement groups and reports were given on the fantastic work that these clubs are doing.

Age Friendly Ireland Committee

Wicklow Station has been nominated to become the next Age Friendly Station. It is in the Planning Stages. An Oversight Committee is being formed and once this happens a Walkability Study will take place.

Disability Inclusion Steering Group (DISC)

The DISC Committee meets regularly, and the May meeting focussed on the "Make Way Day" Campaign. This Campaign is to make people aware of issues that people with a disability face. For example, parking a car on the footpath where a person in a wheelchair cannot pass by and have to go out on the road to continue their journey.

Couch to parkrun programme

Under the Active Community project in Rathnew, 15 participants have been taking part in the couch to parkrun programme over the last 7 weeks. This programme has been designed for beginners to gradually build up their running ability so they can eventually run 5km and progress to participating in a parkrun. This group is now scheduled to complete the Avondale parkrun on Saturday 20th July.

Following on from the ready to go orienteering course that teachers from Shillelagh/Carnew/Tinahely N.S. and Gaelscoil Chill Mhantáin attended, the Healthy Wicklow funding has now arranged from each of these schools to be mapped for future orienteering courses and programmes. Tomnafinnogue Wood in Tinahely has also been mapped.

Mother and Teen Boxercise Programme

A summer 4-week mother and teen (10 – 15-year-old) Boxercise Programme will commence every Friday on 26th July in St Brigid's Hall Rathnew.



Sláintecare Healthy Communities

Bray Resource Family Development Project

75,000 of SEED Funding has been granted to the Bray Children's Family Resource Development Project. This project will build a new Children's Wellness Hub were one play therapist and one family case manager will be based to help the children and families in the community. A steering committee is currently being put together to decide the fundamentals of the type of support and services we will be linking in with.

Little Bray Garden

The Bray Family Resource Development Project was granted 47,072 to refurbish and build a new it for purpose garden space which will sit alongside the children's crèche. BRFDP begin the tendering process to start work on their new 'little garden'. This new garden will provide a sensory experience for children who attend the crèche, families of the communities and elderly. Work will begin in the next month once suitable tenders are hired to begin construction and refurbishment.

Residential Zoned Land Tax (RZLT)

The Government's <u>Housing For All – A New Housing Plan for Ireland</u> has introduced a new tax to activate vacant land for residential purposes as a part of the 'Pathway to Increasing New Housing Supply'. The draft RZLT maps for lands liable in 2025 was published on 01 February 2024. Submissions were invited on the draft maps up to 01 April 2024 with 9 submissions received. Submissions requesting a variation of the zoning of land are invited up to **31 May 2024 and no submissions were recieved**. Determinations on the 9 submissions were issued by 01 July. Vacant Site Levy

This programme is still ongoing and is affected by the proposed deferral of the RZLT. As liability to the RZLT is now proposed to be deferred for one year, it is considered appropriate to maintain provisions in legislation for the management and continued charging of the vacant site levy in respect of land which is

identified on the register. This will continue to facilitate imminent placements on the register, conclusion of appeals and to facilitate the issuing of demands in relation to the levy for the period to the end of 2024. This will ensure that the use of the levy as an active land management measure will continue until the RZLT is in effect.

County Heritage Plan (CHP):

The Heritage Council have approved a funding allocation of €57,000 for projects under the County Heritage Plan Fund 2024. The following projects have commenced, County Heritage Plan Review, Glendalough Community Archaeology Project and Wicklow Community Archaeology Service.

Irish Community Archive Network (iCAN)

Five new community groups have signed up to the *Our Wicklow Heritage* network and are currently receiving training in setting up their digital archives. Training for Wicklow groups took place11th and 12th June.

Archaeology:

Community Monuments Fund- CMF 2024. Six projects have been a successful in receiving funding allocations as per project applications prepared by the Heritage Office and submitted to National Monuments Service. All grants accepted and projects are in early stages of commencement.

Built Heritage Capital Funds (Architecture):

A funding allocation of €101,000 has been received in respect of 16 projects shortlisted for county Wicklow under the Built Heritage Investment Scheme (BHIS). Additionally, four projects have been successful under

the Historic Structures Fund (HSF) as follows; Coolattin House €171,000; Clermont House €171,000; Former Post Office, Shillelagh €20,000 and Vernacular house at Rosebank, Avoca €10,000.

Economic and Rural Development

Town Regeneration

Blessington Town Centre First Masterplan

Blessington is a pathfinder town and is the first to receive funding for a Town Centre First Masterplan. The masterplan will provide Blessington with a clear framework to positively develop the town now and into the future. The implementation of the TCF plan is at the planning stage. RRDF funding will fund the redesign of the Main Street and Market Square and bring those projects to a shovel ready stage where they can be submitted for funding for Category 1 RRDF.

Newtownmountkennedy has been announced under Phase 2 as one of the next 26 towns approved to develop Town Centre First Plans. Funding support of €30,000.00 will be given to the project.

Funding Schemes

Town Centre First – Suite of Supports

Newtownmountkennedy have recently been approved for funding of €30,000.00 under **Town Centre First Measure 2** Suite of Supports. This Town Centre First Plan must be completed and reports submitted to the Department by 5th September 2025.

Baltinglass, Rathdrum and Kilcoole have been selected for funding of €10,000.00 for each of these towns under the **Town Centre First Town Team Support Fund – Measure 1.** This funding can be used to establish town teams where they are already not established or at an early stage of development. All projects under this measure must be completed by 15/11/2024.

The Town Centre First Measure 3 Application closed on the 8th April. Two applications have been submitted for this Project funding,

1. Blessington - measures to include enhancement to the Square with tree planting and rain garden, spaces for dining and fixed seating.

2. Wicklow town – Further enhancement at the Black Castle area to encourage more tourism and attractions for locals with installation of picnic tables, seating and a sculpture park.

Thrive

Under the new Thrive – Town Centre First Heritage Revival Scheme Strand 1, two applications were submitted on the 5th April for Bray and Wicklow Town/Rathnew. Unfortunately these applications were not approved.

The Town Centre First Heritage Revival Strand 2 for Bray Courthouse and Heritage Centre application was submitted to Thrive on the 3rd May.

Town and Village Renewal Scheme 2023

Wicklow Co Council has been awarded €725,000 from the Department of Rural and Community Development under Town & Village Renewal Scheme 2023. The Projects selected were:

- Kirikee, Glenmalure for work on their Community Centre to include renovation of the roof, windows ceilings and walls;
- Lacken to renovate the old school house to be used as a community centre to include café and community shop and a small heritage section; and
- Wicklow Towns, Murrough BMX pump track to develop into a best-in-class asphalt covered pump track for all ages and abilities.

Town Teams

We currently have four Town Teams, Arklow, Wicklow, Greystones and Blessington. Discussions are continuing on the future establishment of a Bray Town Team.

The teams work closely with the Town Regeneration office, attending meetings and giving information on funding and grants available to Town Teams

Rural and Urban Regeneration Development Fund Grant Applications

Steering Group for the Progression of URDF and RRDF Projects

The Chief Executive has established an interdisciplinary team for the progression of Wicklow County Council's URDF (Urban Regeneration and Development Fund) and RRDF (Rural Regeneration and Development Fund) projects. The group meet monthly to streamline the advancement of RRDF and URDF projects along with a sub-group that will meet fortnightly and report to the steering group. This is a significant step in setting up the structures for town regeneration in the County.

These groups continue to meet fortnightly.

Blessington RRDF: Blessington has been awarded over €1m funding under the Rural Regeneration Development Fund (RRDF) to be used for the regeneration of Blessington Town Centre, the development of plans for public realm works, the redevelopment of a vacant/derelict property to create an eHub and a Visitor Centre for the forthcoming Blessington Lakes Greenway.

Baltinglass RRDF: The costing for Baltinglass Gateway to Southwest Wicklow has come in over budget on both the public realm and the Courthouse refurbishment. The proposals have been revised and the necessary technical plans are complete in order to facilitate works commencing. Works on the Public Park and playground are underway.

Newtownmountkennedy RRDF: The project is under review for revisions necessary due to contested issues regarding the design of the public realm. When agreement is reached, the plans will be signed off and submitted for Category 1 funding.

URDF: Urban Regeneration Development Fund

URDF Call 3: The URDF announced recently that Wicklow will receive €2.5 million to assist long term vacancy and dereliction. Four properties have been chosen (two in Arklow and two in Wicklow) and the process has commenced in acquiring these properties. An information gathering notice has been published on a number of the properties seeking information to be directed to the Council.

Another property has been identified in Arklow and we are now awaiting approval from the department to start the process of acquiring this property.

Bray Harbour Improvements: A tender will be issued when URDF funding has been confirmed for the next phase of this project. A business case has been sent to DHL&H and a tender brief is being prepared for the procurement of engineering consultancy services to produce detailed designs, environmental reports and an application to An Bord Pleanala for the proposed works.

Tourism

Wicklow County Council Tourism Office continues to promote County Wicklow as a destination not only to domestic visitors but also on the international market using a range of tools and activities. See below some of the actions that were delivered during June and upcoming events for August:

Taylor Swift's Pebble PR Campaign:

Taylor Swift's concert was a great opportunity to showcase Wicklow's Coastline through a dedicated campaign celebrating the 'Wicklow Pebble' which Taylor picked up while visiting Wicklow. The story was widely picked up on national media including printed and online press and several radio and TV interviews were organised.

Wicklow County Council has developed additional infrastructure to support sea-based clubs and commercial providers. Bray, Greystones, Kilcoole, Wicklow Town, Brittas Bay and Arklow are currently being considered for the highly sought after Blueway accreditation. More info at Wicklow BlueWay -Wicklow County Tourism (visitwicklow.ie)

Road Cycling Central Wicklow Routes

Five cycling routes have been designed which bring cyclists through the Wicklow Mountains, ranging from 15km to 60km. The challenging routes are rewarded with some of Wicklow's most scenic locations including Clara Vale, Glendalough, Roundwood, Glenmalure Valley and more. See the routes at https://visitwicklow.ie/road-cycling-routes-in-central-wicklow/

Abbey Grounds, Wicklow

Work continues on the Fáilte Ireland Destination Towns project at Abbey Grounds. Following procurement, the contractor for the Coach House has commenced work on the building. The other elements of the project, including the amphitheatre and landscaping will run parallel.

Glendalough Masterplan and Wicklow Visitor Orientation Study

Following from the launch of the Glendalough and Wicklow Mountains National Park Visitor Experience and Management Masterplan, work has begun on the implementation of the Plan. A Steering Group has been established, which is chaired by the Chief Executive of Wicklow County Council.

A Working Group comprising representatives from all stakeholders has also been formed and has commenced work on short term actions for 2024, along with longer term actions. As community consultation and participation is a central tenet of the masterplan, a Local Advisory Group has been established to keep the local community informed and ensure their input to the process.

Improvements to traffic management and the additional car parking spaces provided with kind permission of the Brockagh Resource Centre and Laragh GAA have been welcomed by both visitors and locals alike. Directional signage has been erected to ensure an easier flow of traffic and this is supplemented by a dedicated social media campaign advising visitors where to access car parks.

Special Projects

Greystones Enterprise Hub: Work has begun for the fit-out of the hub. It is expected to be ready for launch in the 3rd quarter.

Sites on Mill Road, Greystones: Progress on the Mill Road sites is on hold pending PRA confirmation of site registration.

Carnew Remote Working Hub: A preliminary design is due in July with a final design agreement expected in mid-August. Where Part VIII planning permission is required, an application will be made before the end of the year.

Marketing Plan: MarketingCoach are working on promotional materials for the Marketing Plan for County Wicklow, highlighting the availability of Remote Working Hubs and Broadband Connection Points under the campaign idea "Choose Wicklow".

Offshore Renewable Energy

The Offshore Renewable Energy (ORE) Network continues to meet regularly and engage with the offshore renewable energy companies who are developing proposals off the coast of County Wicklow. A plan for 2024 based around three work-streams (skills, ports/harbours, and supply chain) has been agreed.

Skills Strategy

The Skills Strategy for County Wicklow was presented to the members at their meeting on the 1st July. The Skills Taskforce will now begin implementation of the actions contained within the Skills Strategy.

Food and Beverage Strategy

Wicklow Naturally:

Wicklow Naturally held its first networking event of 2024 on Tuesday the 9th of July. The event was hosted by O'Hanlon Herbs in Glenealy and was attended by more than 30 participants. The event included a visit of the herb factory and updates from the coordinators on Wicklow Naturally activities.

Preparatory work for Destination Wicklow, a project focusing on telling the story of Wicklow Naturally members and their products is underway. Wicklow Naturally has engaged a Content Creator to shoot short videos and photos of the various producers and other members of the network. The content will be widely used on social media to promote Wicklow Naturally members and their products.

Wicklow Naturally will host a demo kitchen at the Tinahely Show in the Best of Wicklow marquee with celebrity chef and Wicklow Naturally Ambassador Catherine Fulvio as the main guest.

Plans are well underway for an exciting October Feast 2024 festival.

Control of Dogs

For the month of June 539 dog licences were purchased, with 268, or approximately 50% purchased on line. Dog wardens are weekly carrying out inspections in localities in County Wicklow. For the month of June 2023 there were 306 dog licences purchased. There has been a 57% increase in licences purchased on the same month last year.

Blue Flags & Green Coast Awards

The Blue Flag and Green Flag seasons kicked off on 1st June and runs until 15th September. The three beaches in County Wicklow awarded the Blue Flag are: Brittas Bay North & South and Greystones South. After an absence of 4 years Arklow South Beach regained the Green Coast Award. An Taisce will monitor the beaches for compliance with Blue Flag criteria.

Projects Office

Whitestown Remediation Project

The draft remediation plan has been presented to the court and has been approved in part. Tender Documents for the Outlets for Material excavated from the site and also for the main contractor are presently being prepared.

Avoca Mines Remediation Project

The Council is working in Partnership with DECC to advance the Remediation of the Avoca Mines project. Currently, this work primarily involves making the mines sites safe, by replacing fencing and making safe access to locations that require sampling and monitoring. The contract has been awarded to complete the fencing around Cronebane and Tigroney sections of the Mines. Monitoring and repair works to existing fencing continues.



Arklow Flood Relief Scheme

Planning Application and CPO has been approved by An Bord Pleanála. Byrne Looby Partners Ltd., (now known as Ayesa) has been appointed to carry out the detailed design and tender stage of the project. Site Investigation and Archaeological Investigations will be carried out in 2024.

Wicklow Arts Office

Cruinniú na nÓg

On Saturday 15th June, just over 2,000 children and young people from all over County Wicklow participated in our 12 townland hubs, including those from coastal areas to the mountains and rural villages, enjoying a day of free creative activity as part of Cruinniú na nÓg.

An initiative of the Creative Ireland Programme, it was developed and delivered by Wicklow County Council's Arts Office in partnership with many local arts and community organisations. A wide range of artforms were represented with workshops themed around dance, movie making, costuming for film and television, music performances, composition, illustration, nature art, environmentally themed art and much more.

Highlights for the day included the performances by new communities as part of the Baltinglass Festival Programme in the Community Garden, with children from Ukraine performing in Flowers for Ukraine, children of various nationalities from Kippure Lodge performing, and children drumming from Slaney Court in the town of Baltinglass.

Also featured were the Irish Dancers from Gohery School of Irish Dancing and workshops from ten local professional artists on the day, who worked providing workshops to the hundreds of young people who took part.

In Rathdrum, children from third class in the three primary schools of St. Saviours National School, Rathdrum Boys National School and Our Lady's Girls National School showcased their work 'Beyond the Trees' in a premiere performance of a climate themed work which they composed with Music Generation Wicklow and composer Tom Lane and visual artist Louise Shearer.

In Greystones at Tiglin Coolnagreina, children and young people of Ukraine worked with Rhyme Island to create their own unique rap and concert performance.

Several workshops took place across the county in Library Service branches; the Courthouse Arts Centre and Mermaid Arts Centre had paper play and the Beatles Hits for kids, with stellar performances also by children and young people in Arklow, supported by Arklow Music and Arts.

The budget was 30,000.00 and was funded by Creative Ireland.

Film Awards

Launched by Laura Whitmore from Bray earlier in April 2024, the new Film Award Scheme an initiative of Wicklow County Arts Office and Wicklow Screen Office of Wicklow County Council and supported by Clermont Screen Hub received x applications. Shortlisting was held at Ardmore Studios overseen by independent consultant Brian O'Regan of Arts Leaders and panellists Jade of the National Talent Academy and Dave of x. x number of these applicants were called to a pitching interview which took place in Clermont Wicklow County Campus on May 31st. The panel were supported on this occasion by Arts Officer Jenny Sherwin and Screen Officer John Powderly. Following rigorous deliberation, two short films and their creative teams were selected. There will as intended therefore be two awards of 15,000.00 made available to these applicants. The formal internal process is currently underway and once that is complete, with all applicants informed of the outcome, the announcement will be made public.

Sing in Wicklow Awards

The Sing in Wicklow Award supports collective singing across County Wicklow. Specifically created to advance the professional development of choirs, singing groups, and musical directors, the scheme aims to extend valuable opportunities for community participation in choral singing.

The Sing in Wicklow Award forms part of a wider set of actions created by Wicklow County Council and funded by Creative Ireland to support the existing community choral infrastructure and enhance participation levels under the Creative Wicklow Strategy 2023 – 2027.

A callout for applications was circulated on 16th April 2024 with a deadline for receipt of applications 10th May 2024. A total of fourteen applications were received.

The applications were assessed by independent consultant Katherine Zeserson and supported in a non-scoring capacity by Jenny Sherwin, Arts Officer.

Kalaidescope Stage

The Arts Office has supported a number of initiatives which will take to the stage for Kalaidescope.

These are all supported through our funding arrangement with Music Generation Wicklow. Our joint project – the Kippure Lodge Community Choir a young people's project are just one of a number of the groups who will take to the stage each night of the Festival between 5pm and 8pm.

West Wicklow Festival

West Wicklow Festival presented a bumper line up of classical music performances in Russborough House and Blessington. Another Arts Office Strategic youth project was part of the WWF with Peter and the Wolf performances for 220 children and families with craft outreach workshops taking place within it. WCC also fund WWF through our annual Arts Festival Awards. This is the biggest arts festival in West Wicklow.

Dunlavin Festigal of Arts

Dunlavin Arts Festival is a valuable community led arts festival event held in Dunlavin. 2024 marked the 40th year of the Festival, a significant milestone for the Festival and possibly the longest running arts festival not only in West Wicklow but all of County Wicklow. The Festival was funded through the Arts Festival Scheme but also a purchase of an Artwork by Trevor Geoghan, a recently deceased County Wicklow professional artist was bought as part of the WCC Art Collection to support the 40th year of the Festival.

Strategic Project Award Scheme

The Strategic Project Award Scheme is eligible for application by independent artist or collaborating artists. This annual Scheme will open slightly later for application this year due to resources, in July. Each year approximately 100,000.00 is awarded to 8 or 9 applicants to deliver high quality developmental initiatives which support the implementation of the Council's Arts Strategy.

Culture Night

Culture Night this year is on Friday September 20th, 2024. This National Initiative has been presented in Wicklow for 14 years now and is well developed. Thousands of people access the Arts Office programme throughout the county on this night each year and all for free. Preparation has begun for the presentation of the 2024 programme in June and will continue up until September.

Creative Places Baltinglass

Rathcoran Residency 22nd June:

The 'Community Planting & Street Feast Festival Day 'at Rathcoran housing estate took place on 25th May the final day of this residency will be a community day on June 22nd. Artist and permaculture expert Suzie Cahn lead a community

planting and participatory workshops. The community residents enjoyed participating in the events laid on and brought along dishes native to their countries of origin to share with others.

Baltinglass Sings Community Choir 21st June:

Final Year Creative Places Baltinglass:

The final year of the Creative Places Baltinglass 3 year programme was awarded on June 19th. Further to the application made by the Arts Office, WCC will receive the maximum award of 150,000.00 under the Scheme.

Creative Places Arts Council National Review Meeting Baltinglass

On June 27th Amanda Boiling an associate consultant working for the Arts Council will visit Baltinglass as part of their national evaluative process. Amanda will meet with four different groups of stakeholders, artists, residents and the steering group. This is to inform the learning on the National Creative Places Programme with a view to gathering the learnings of Baltinglass to contribute to the data profile. It is likely that there is continuation funding for Creative Places Baltinglass and other Creative Places Programmes which will be influenced by this evaluative process.

Ali McGuire writes fiction, poetry, and essays centred on what it means to be human, particularly a woman. She was a 2024 IWC Novel Fair finalist, has been featured in The Independent's New Irish Writing, and made the Fish Short Story and Poetry longlists in 2023. She holds a first-class master's in creative writing from DCU. Ali lives way down in South County Wicklow with kids, dogs, and a very patient husband.

Ben McGuire won the Coast to Coast-to-Coast Journal Prize in 2023, and the resulting pamphlet, published in Liverpool, is *Luke the World: Elegies for a Brother*. Poems of his have appeared in *Poetry Ireland Review*, *Stand* and *The Irish Times*, and been commended in the Troubadour Prize. He lives in Bray.

The value of the mentorship is €1,500.00 for each writer.

Archives & Genealogy Service

Archives special projects

The Archives Service have been granted funding under the Heritage Council's Heritage Stewardship grants scheme 2024. The project is on the Tate Charity Trust collection (1787-1990): To produce a descriptive catalogue, exhibition and online resources. In 1787 John Tate of Glenmalure bequeathed his lands of 895 acres to the parishioners of Rathdrum. Tate vested the property into the hands of five named Trustees and they along with their successors administered the Charity known as John Tate's Charity, with the capital gained from this estate down through the years of its existence up to the present day. This project will enable us to make accessible to researchers this incredible collection both through a descriptive list and also through interpretation in terms of the exhibition and articles, promoting to as wide an audience as possible. The descriptive list is now complete, and details of the exhibition and online resources will follow shortly.

Irish Community Archives Network – Our Wicklow Heritage

<u>Our Wicklow Heritage</u> online community archives network is Wicklow County Council's partnership project with the National Museum of Ireland and the Heritage Council. The Wicklow network is administered through a collaboration between the Heritage, Archives and Local Studies services of Wicklow County Council. The network is expanding with new Wicklow community groups coming on board from Blessington, Roundwood, Wicklow and Tinahely. The new groups are receiving training from the National Museum, including content writing for the web, copyright and social media. The new sites are due to be launched in the Autumn, bringing the total number of groups on the Wicklow ICAN network to ten, as well as the county site, which is managed by the Heritage, Local Studies and Archives services of Wicklow County Council.

Outdoor Recreation

Wicklow Coast Blueway

The Wicklow Coast Blueway project is moving towards the second stage of the accreditation process with the current accreditation mainly reliant on provider-based activities. Blueway promotion, links and signage being developed. Project completion due in March 2025, with works at various stages of completion on the selected Blueway Nodes:

<u>Greystones</u> – Accessible boardwalk installed at South Beach. Works completed.

<u>Brittas Bay</u> – Accessible toilet, upgraded toilets, new larger water tank and new outdoor shower facilities. Car parking painting and tidy up. Works completed.

<u>Wicklow Town</u> –New outdoor showers, upgraded toilet facilities and path upgrading at Harbour area. Works commenced in June and are in progress.

<u>Arklow</u> – New boardwalk at South Beach, works commenced in June. Licence Agreement being finalised with Roadstone, landowner, with new facility works at the Cove to commence after the summer season.

Outdoor Recreation Infrastructure Scheme

The Outdoor Recreation Infrastructure Scheme (ORIS) supports the development of new outdoor recreational infrastructure and the necessary repair, enhancement, or promotion of existing outdoor recreation infrastructure in countryside areas across Ireland. The Scheme is funded under "Our Rural Future" which specifically prioritises the growing outdoor activity tourism sector as part of a long-term vision for a vibrant and sustainable rural Ireland.

ORIS funding for Measures 2 and 3 projects announced

On the 6th of June 2024, Minister for Rural and Community Development, Heather Humphreys TD, announced a €16.1 million investment in outdoor recreation projects right across the country. This funding will be invested in 69 larger scale outdoor recreation projects nationwide.

These projects under Measures 2 and 3 are to receive funding of up to €200,000 and €500,000 respectively and will be delivered by July 2026.

3 of those Measure 2 projects have been approved for funding for County Wicklow with a total budget of €594,000 to implement around the County:

Speed Limits

New guidelines for managing speed limits have been announced. The initial proposal is for all rural local roads without an existing special speed limit in rural areas will be reduced from 80km/h to 60km/h, this is due to introduced in November with signage to be installed prior to that date. A tender for the poles (c. 420) for the required signage has been issued.

Noise Action Plan

The Wicklow Noise Action Plan is currently being assessed for SEA & AA. Public consultation will commence following this assessment.

The public consultation for Dublin Agglomeration Noise Action Plan (NAP) has been completed. This plan includes the majority of Bray town.

M11N11 Junction 4 to 14 Improvement Scheme

The Option Selection report was published along with Bulletin #11 on the project website <u>www.n11m11.ie</u> on 14 December 2021. The publication followed the review of submissions received during public display in 2021. Phase 3 Design and Environmental Evaluation was due to commence in Q1 2022. The scheme is currently suspended as no funding is provided. The Wicklow County Council project team are continuing to meet with the public and any interested parties.

M11N11 Bus Priority Interim Scheme

The BPIS seeks to achieve the early delivery of bus priority measures in advance of the main scheme between Loughlinstown Roundabout and Junction 9 (Glenview). The scheme is currently at the Options Selection phase (Phase 2 of TII's Project Management Guidelines).

A non-statutory public display on the emerging preferred options for sections A and C took place in November 2022. A further non-statutory public display event was held in the Glenview Hotel in September 2023 that presented the overall emerging preferred option for the BPIS between Loughlinstown Roundabout and Junction 9 (Glenview).

The public display documents are available to view on the project website www.n11m11bpis.ie.

A significant negative response was received during the public consultation to the proposed closure of the N11 access to the Herbert Road.

Further environmental studies and traffic analysis have been completed on elements of the emerging preferred option. As a result, further consideration is being given to the preferred options at J8 Kilmacanogue, J7 Bray south (including Herbert Road access) and J6 Fassaroe (including the R117 access).

N11 Parallel Service Road at Kilmacanogue

A noise assessment to the east of the new Parallel Service Road Scheme was carried out during April and May 2022. The options review and design commenced in March 2023 following confirmation of funding from TII. Site investigation works were completed in November 2023. This information has been reviewed by the Design Team and the final design option has been prepared. Direct consultation has taken place with the affected residents/landowners. The procurement of a contractor for the construction works is currently being progressed by the project team.

N81 Knockroe Bend Realignment

Tenders for a Per-Cent Art Feature are being procured by the Arts Office. The preferred feature has been selected pending the completion of the final assessment stage.

N81 Irishtown West, Whitestown Lower, Hangman's Bend and Tuckmill Lower "N81 Four Studies"

Following completion of Phase 1 feasibility studies (The N81 Four Studies – Feasibility Report), Wicklow County Council are now progressing the following two projects:

- N81 Whitestown Lower Project; and
- N81 Hangman's Bend and Tuckmill Project.

The Phase 2 Options Selection work is currently progressing under TII's Project Management Guidelines. A non-statutory Public Display event on the Route Options took place in the Inis Fail Germaines, Main Street, Baltinglass, on Wednesday 27th March 2024. The public display documents are available to view on the project website www.N81whitestownandtuckmill.ie. The period for submissions ended on Friday 26th April 2024. The next steps are to further develop the options in order to establish the emerging preferred option.

N81 Pavement Capital Works

Drainage works and the resurfacing of 1km of the N81 between Tuckmill and Saundersgrove were completed in May 2024. Two other sections of the N81 received surfacing renewal works namely at N81 Trooperstown Blessington and N81 Mullycagh Lower. Works were fully completed by end May 2024.

N81 Hollywood Cross Rural Traffic Calming Road Safety Improvement Scheme (RSIS)

The Feasibility and Options report (Phase 2) was approved by TII in November 2023. The Design Report (Phase 3) was approved by TII in April 2024. The Part 8 statutory process (Phase 4) commenced on the 28th March 2024 with the period for submissions by interested parties ending on the 14th May 2024. At the May 2024 meeting of Baltinglass Municipal District the Elected Members voted to approve the Chief Executive's recommendation for the scheme to proceed. The Detailed Design and Contract Documents (Phase 5) are being prepared in advance of tendering for a contractor for construction.

Park & Ride/Share at Hollywood

A feasibility report, funded by the Baltinglass Municipal District was prepared and submitted to TII in Oct 2021. This report considered an option for parking accessed from the N81. TII subsequently provided funding to further examine the feasibility and options.

TII have indicated that they do not support the proposed additional access to the N81. As a result, the option for a parking facility accessed from the N81 has been discounted from the traffic calming scheme. Suitable parking locations, that can be accessed from the regional/local road network, are being investigated.

N81 Blessington Gateway Project

The Feasibility and Options report (Phase 2) was finalised and approved by TII in October 2023. TII have also approved funding to proceed with the design phase in accordance with TII Standards. Wicklow County Council are progressing this project to the design phase (Phase 3) to be followed by any necessary statutory approvals process (Phase 4).

N11/M11 Strategic Bus Park & Ride Facilities

Proposals for bus-based Park & Ride facilities are being progressed adjacent to the N11/M11 at Junctions 6 (Fassaroe), Junction 11 (Kilpedder) and Junction 16 (Ashford/Rathnew).

The Park & Ride at Junction 6 Fassaroe was approved by the Elected Members at the meeting of the full Council in November 2023.

The design for the Bus Park & Rides at Junction 11 (Kilpedder) and Junction 16 (Ashford/Rathnew) are being progressed in conjunction with the NTA Park & Ride Delivery Office.

Arklow Public Realm

The Parade Ground Public Realm works are complete on site. Following a meeting with DoHLGH, Project Completion Reports were submitted with additional funding requested in December 2023. The OGP Inflation Payment has been agreed with the contractor with payment to currently being processed.

Arklow to Shillelagh Greenway

We are in the final stages of Phase 2 Options Selection, which will determine the preferred route for the Greenway with landowner consultation ongoing. Following this, we will proceed to Phase 3, involving Design and Environmental Evaluation.

Baltinglass Town Centre Plan

Enabling works started in Baltinglass in mid-February with the WCC Direct Labour crew completing site investigation works and starting on utility works. The consultants are actively engaged in preparing final construction documents for the delivery of the town centre works.

Blessington Inner Relief Road

The current focus of the project is on the detailed design phase, including the preparation of associated documents such as the Compulsory Purchase Order (CPO) documentation. These efforts are crucial to advance the scheme towards obtaining statutory approval. Given the potential impact of the project on the Poulaphuca Special Protection Area (SPA), it is necessary to prepare a Natura Impact Statement (NIS) to assess and document any potential effects on the SPA. Once the detailed design and associated documents, including the NIS, are completed, the project will proceed to seek statutory approval from An Bord Pleanála.

Wicklow County Council Compulsory Purchase (Chapel Road Pedestrian and Cycle Infrastructure Improvement Scheme) No. 1 Order 2021

The CPO Notice to Treat was issued on all landowners in October 2023. There is active engagement between Wicklow Roads Project staff and landowners and a Wicklow County Council appointed valuer is engaging with valuers and homeowners as part of the CPO process. Consultants are making steady progress in the detailed design phase and are currently focused on preparing the tender documents and drawings for the construction phase with these documents anticipated to be issued Q3 2024.

Wicklow Greystones Greenway

Meetings and information sharing is ongoing with Irish Rail for their East Coast Rail Infrastructure Protection Project. Meeting with the National Parks and Wildlife Service (NPWS) took place in June 2023.

A 4 weeklong public consultation period has recently been completed for the emerging route corridors. The project was presented at the April Council meeting with two public events taking place in Greystones and Wicklow during April.

Blessington eGreenway

Under Section 177AE of the Planning and Development Act, we have formally submitted our planning documents to An Bord Pleanála. Given the need to conduct comprehensive additional surveys and generate a substantial volume of supporting material, An Bord Pleanála granted an extension to the submission deadline for additional information to January 29th, 2024. As this information has been deemed significant additional information by ABP we were required to undertake a public consultation period taking place in May and June 2024 for a 6 week period and are currently waiting on an update from ABP.

Active Travel Updates

Projects under Construction

Ballyguilemore Active Travel Facilities (Wicklow MD)

Provision of new pedestrian facilities and road safety improvements along the Ballyguilemore Road between Carrig View and the entrance to the proposed new St. Patricks GAA Pitch. The scheme includes for new footpaths and road widening works. Construction works are progressing well on site, with embankment construction works completed on the western side. Public lighting and drainage works are ongoing.

Arklow South Cycle and Pedestrian Scheme (Arklow MD)

Provision of 2.8km of segregated cycle track along the R-772 Wexford Road, Arklow between Knockmore Roundabout and M11 Junction 21. The scheme will also construct 1.4km approx. of pedestrian footpath. Accommodation works are ongoing on the northbound carriageway. Preparation works have commenced for the slip form kerbing on the northbound carriageway.

Safe Routes to Schools: St. Kevin's National School, Greystones (Greystones MD)

Provide infrastructure for schools to increase walking and cycling as the preferred travel mode where possible and improve safety at front of schools. Front of school implementation works are completed. Detail design being completed for the footpath connection from Church Lane. NTA approval has been received to move to construction stage. Consultation is ongoing with school and local residents.

Project Updates

Bray Transport Interchange (Bray MD)

New plaza and public transport interchange in front of Bray DART station, with revised car parking, set down and taxi rank arrangements. David Walsh Civil Engineering has commenced works on site.

David Walsh Civil Engineering commenced ground works in Mid-February. Works are ongoing on the installing the new drainage system for the project. Footpath works have commenced on Quinsborough Road.

Wicklow Active Travel Pathfinder Project (Wicklow MD)

The project scope has been changed and will focus on the provision of high-quality pedestrian and cycle facilities along R750 from Wicklow Town Car Park and along Station Road. It will also include the provision of a new pedestrian and Cycle Bridge linking Station Road to Wicklow Town relief Road. Traffic surveys have been completed and work is ongoing on the preliminary design for the route.

Wicklow Station Pedestrian and Cycle Link (Wicklow MD)

New pedestrian and cycle bridge to be provided at Wicklow Train Station, linking Station Road to the Port Access Road. Bus and vehicle set down to be provided along with cycle parking. Part 8 report being prepared for submission to the Council Members.

Greystones Active Travel - Pathfinder Project (Greystones MD)

Provision of new and improved pedestrian and cycle links to Greystones Train Station. The spine route extends from Greystones Marina to Shoreline Sports Centre. The project will include improved pedestrian and cycle crossings along the Charlesland Dual Carriageway. Baseline assessment required by Department of Transport as part of Pathfinder. Tender to issue for contractor to carry out

and cyclist improvements on Charlesland Dual Carriageway. Preliminary Design of route from Greystones Marina to Shoreline Sports Park to be issued to NTA for approval.

Safe Routes to Schools: Scoil Nioclas Naofa, Dunlavin (Baltinglass MD)

Provide infrastructure for schools to increase walking and cycling as the preferred travel mode where possible and improve safety at front of schools. Presentation made to Baltinglass MD Members. Preliminary Design being finalised. Scheme will be advertised under Section 38 of Roads Act.

Safe Routes to Schools: Gaelscoil na gCloch Liath, Greystones Educate Together & Temple Carrig School (Greystones MD)

Provide improvements on Blacklion Manor Road to make the area safer for school children. These works aim to encourage more children to walk and cycle to school. Preliminary Design is being prepared.

Kilcoole Road Footpath (Greystones MD)

Footpath to be constructed linking Greystones to Kilcoole. Meeting held with landowner to discuss accommodation works. A design has been prepared and issued to the landowner for agreement. Once the design is agreed a tender will be run to appoint a Contractor. It is hoped to begin construction in Q3 this year.

Bridge Rehabilitation (Local and Regional Roads)

Work on 4 new bridges was completed in June/July. Works "in-stream" has commenced at 2 locations on the Sally Gap

Winter Maintenance

The changeover to brine has commenced with fleet upgrades. Remainder to be tendered.

Surface Dressing

Works commenced on Monday June 24th. 15 sites complete. 26 sites remain.

Poor weather conditions have contributed to a slower output than normal.

Machinery Yard

Croí Cónaithe (Towns, Cities and Rural) - Vacant Property Refurbishment Grant

The Vacant Property Refurbishment Grant is a payment you can get if you are turning a vacant house or building into your permanent home or a rental property. The grant applies to qualifying vacant properties in cities, towns, villages and rural parts of the country.

A grant of up to €70,000 is available.

If the refurbishment costs exceed the standard grant of up to €50,000, a top-up grant amount of up to €20,000 is available.

To qualify for the grant, applicants must:

- Have proof of ownership or evidence of active negotiations to buy the property (that is, confirmation of engagement from the estate agent or owner of the property) where you are seeking approval in principle for a grant.
- Live in the property as your principal private residence or make it available for rent.
- have proof that the property has been vacant for at least 2 years and that it was built up to and including 2007.

Operational Fire Statistics June2024

There were **87 incidents** attended during the month of June 2024. Due to laid down procedures to mobilise two stations to potentially serious incident types, individual Fire Stations were mobilised on a total of **112 occasions** including **7** mobilisations in other counties. On no occasion did an incident commander request additional resources over what was prescribed in the Pre-Determined Attendance.

Operational activity for the month of June 2024 **decreased by 29% (minus 46 mobilisations) on the preceding month** (May 2024: 158 mobilisations). There was a decrease in domestic house fires (-15 mobilisations), a decrease in incidents in other counties (-12 mobilisations) and a decrease in malicious outdoor fires (-5 mobilisations).

Operational activity for the month of June 2024 **decreased by 35% (minus 61 mobilisations) on the equivalent month in 2023** (June 2023, 173 mobilisations). Year on year there was a decrease in domestic fires (-6 mobilisations), RTCs (-4 mobilisations), rural fires (-17 mobilisations), malicious outdoor fires (-20 mobilisations) and incidents in other counties (-11).

Examples of Incidents attended:

- 01/06/2024 Wicklow Town and Rathdrum crews attended a single vehicle RTC at Ballycullen. The vehicle had rolled over and there were two patients.
- 01/06/2024 Blessington crew supported by crew from Naas assisted at an RTC involving a car and a motorcycle.
- 07/06/2024 Bray and Greystones crews attended a domestic house fire at Ard na Greine, Bray. The fire was extinguished on the first floor and medical assistance was provided to the occupants.
- 13/06/2024 Dunlavin and Baltinglass crews attended a 2 vehicle RTC at Merginstown.
- 16/06/2024 Blessington crew provided protracted medical intervention for unconscious patient at Kilbride.
- 16/06/2024 Carnew and Tinahely crews attended a 2 car RTC in Carnew.
- 20/06/2024 Rathdrum and Dunlavin crews attended a serious motorcycle RTC on the Wicklow Gap.

Incidents in County Kildare (5-incidents total) examples:

- 17/06/2024 Dunlavin crew were mobilised to an "ambulance assist" in Calverstown.
- 19/06/2024 Balitnglass crew were mobilised to a tractor fire at Davidstown.
- 22/06/2024 Blessington crew supported crews from Naas at an industrial fire in Ballymore Eustace.

• 25/06/2024 Carnew crew supported crews from Gorey at an RTC at Rossminoge, Craanford.

50 new residential houses and 14 Extensions were notified to LA for Commencement & 65 newly completed residential units plus 2 non-residential units were submitted, assessed and validated in June. There has been an increase in both Commencement Notice particularly in Opt out Submissions and Certificate of Compliance on Completion submissions compared to the same period in 2023. As speed of construction increases with seasonal changes, CCC submissions increased in June.

BER certificates for all newly completed units were requested & submitted to Building Control as per S.I. No. 243/2012 - European Union (Energy Performance of Buildings) Regulations 2012.

Building Control continued with site inspections in June to identify non-compliances with Building Regs onsite and 2 Section 11 Compliance Requests were issued.

Revised Information requests remained high in June for both Commencement Notices and Certificates of Compliance on Completion, 65% of Commencement Notice submissions & 88% of Certificate of Compliance on Completion submissions required revised information. Revised information requests are issued to nominated role holders of submissions when compliance with Building Regs has not been demonstrated. Building Control have observed numerous Commencement Notice Submissions that are currently 'Revised Information' status on BCMS and awaiting validation.

Opt Out submissions are both extensions and single unit dwellings, generally from BCMS users who are unfamiliar with both BCMS and Building Regulations which leads to Building Control resources being directed to resolving both administration and technical issues with Opt-Out Submissions. Wicklow Building Control continues to perform rigorous assessment of submissions at commencement stage and onsite presence during construction. These methods remain the best way to promote compliance with Building Regs.

In June, BC Staff attended the Regional Building Control Quarterly meeting held in Westmeath.


Civil Defence




General Municipal Allocation and Discretionary Fund 2024
