In the meantime, if the Board would wish to meet a deputation from our body to discuss the matter, with a view to an amicable settlement of our admitted grievances, we will be pleased to send a deputation to the Boardroom on any suitable date.

Nov. 11th, 1918.

I beg to report for your information that since your last meeting seventy nine cases of influenza have been admitted to the Rathdrum Union Hospital. Fifteen of these cases were admitted from the body of the House. In addition, Murse Harrington and two attendants (paid). rurner Patrick Fogarty and Ellen Fogarty, have contracted the disease. Twelve patients in Hospital have also contracted it. Many of the cases received were of an extremely virulent type. Those who fell ill here have not been so severely attacked. Eight patients all told have died from influenza. Two other patients have died since last Board meeting, one from heart disease and the other (an infant) from malnutrition. The Hospital is now greatly overcrowded, and cases of influenza are being received into the Fever Hospital. The Master, at my request, requisitioned the services of two additional murses from Dublin, also a paid attendant. Owing to the great number of cases which entail an immense amount of washing and cleaning, I would recommend that at least two extra female attendants be employed for the General Hospital during the present emergency; also, that a paid female attendant be sent to the Fever Hospital. At present women do not appear amxious to accept work in the Hospital. However, if the Master were empowereddto employ them at something more than the ordinary remuneration it might meet the difficulty.

As regarded then provision of a press in which to keep poisons, the Local Government Board drew attention to the concluding paragraph of their letter of 5th April, 1917, relative to the death of Michael Lawless in the Workhouse Infirmary.

Read report of Dr Dillon, as follows :-There are no Convalescent Wards or Dayrooms in the Institution. Operations are performed in one of the Wards. There are no wards set apart for Consumptives. There is one Ambulance driven by motor. There is a second ambulance which cannot be used as it needs repair. All the walls of the Institution need to be colour washed. There are no blinds. There is a storage tank from which water is supplied. This should be filled from springs near the Workhouse. There are two W.C.'s in each of the yards of the Infirmary. There is not sufficient water for flushing. There are two flexd baths on each side but there was no water in the pipes. Some knives, forks and spoons are required. There were 5 deaths of children under two years in past 12 months. No record is kept of all the surgical instrucments and appliances in use and in stock. There is no locked cabinet for poisons.

The Local Government Board observed that the Guardians appeared to have fallen into a prevalent error of regarding a maximum price as equivalent to a standard price from which there can be no deviation, When the maximum price of an article was flexd by the Food control Committee, it was meant that the article cannot be sold at a higher price than that indicated, but it did not put any obstacle in the way of a sale at a lower figure. Maximum prices were based on what would constitute a fair profit to vendors under the most unfavourable conditions for the production and sale of the articles under control, but it was not intended that such prices should be charged invariably whenever a sale took place, no matter what might be the state of the markets and local conditions as regards transport facilities, number of consumers and cost of production. In other words different prices might be charged in different districts for the same article, so long as the maximum price was not exceeded. In the present instance the Local Government Board saw no grounds for the claim made by the milk contractors, and it was evident that the price in a country district advantageously situated like Rathdrum for the output of milk should not be so high as in a city like Dublin where milk must be conveyed from a distance by rail or other means of transport and where any cattle that are kept for dairy purposes must be stall fed. In such a case the fixing of a maximum rate, in connection with which cognizance had to be taken of the conditions prevailing in Dublin and other cities, should not and did not preclude the possibility of sales at a much lower rate in more favoured localities. In the absence of a minimum price for milk or of any order of the Food Control Committee affecting existing contracts, the Local Government Board had no authority enabling them to sanction an increase in the contract price for milk supplied to the Workhouse.


