Read letter No. 15,535/1918, dated 1st April, 1916, from the Local Government Board, stating that they had had before them the replies to queries respecting Dr John J. Falvey, whom the Guardians proposed to appoint at the remuneration of £4 : 4 : 0 a week as resident temporary substitute for the Medical Officer of the Aughrim Dispensary District, who was absent on service with the Royal Army Medical Corps for the period of the war; and with reference thereto the Local government Board desired to point out that the fee of £4 : 4 .: 0 a week was fixed to compensate Medical men for taking up duty for short periods, but where, as in the present instance, the term of employment is indefinitely prolonged, the Board had decided some months ago that the salary to be allowed to a substitute should not exceed that enjoyed by the permanent Medical Officer. The Local Government Board considered, therefore, that £130 a year as Dospensary Medical Officer and £15 as Medical Officer of Health would afford reasonable remuneration in this case, and they were prepared to accord their sanction to Dr Falvey's appointment if he were willing to accept the post on these terms.

Read letter dated March 28th, 1916, from Dr J. J. Falvey, 52 Grosvenor Square, Dublin, stating that he had been waiting for some weeks to hear about his appointment being sanctioned, and asking how this could be accounted for.
