Ryan, National School teacher, Brittas, stating that he had seen from a Press report that complaint had been made that the children John and Edward Duffy had been absent from school for thirty days during the months of April and May last. On June 26th last we were anticipating trouble in the coal trade; we asked your Board's permission to finish our contract by motor delivery (as we found horses too slow, and also uncertain to procure), which after due consideration at your meeting was refused, and requesting that we deliver over the Union ouncils as heretofore, although you never mentioned this when advertising for tenders. Up to that time we had supplied 45tons 11 cwts. 3 qrs., which left a balance due of 154 tons 8 cwts. lqr. Early in July the coal crisis arrived, the men going out on strike, with the result that all contracts were cancelled. Not only did the cost of coal advance but freights went up every other day, so we have had to pay the advance, viz., 4/9 per ton extra, to complete our contract. At first we thought of severing out bond (which owing to strike clause we could have done but on considering the very happy relations that have existed between your Board and ourselves since we first became contractors, we decided to complete the order, and then to place the matter before you for consideration. 
