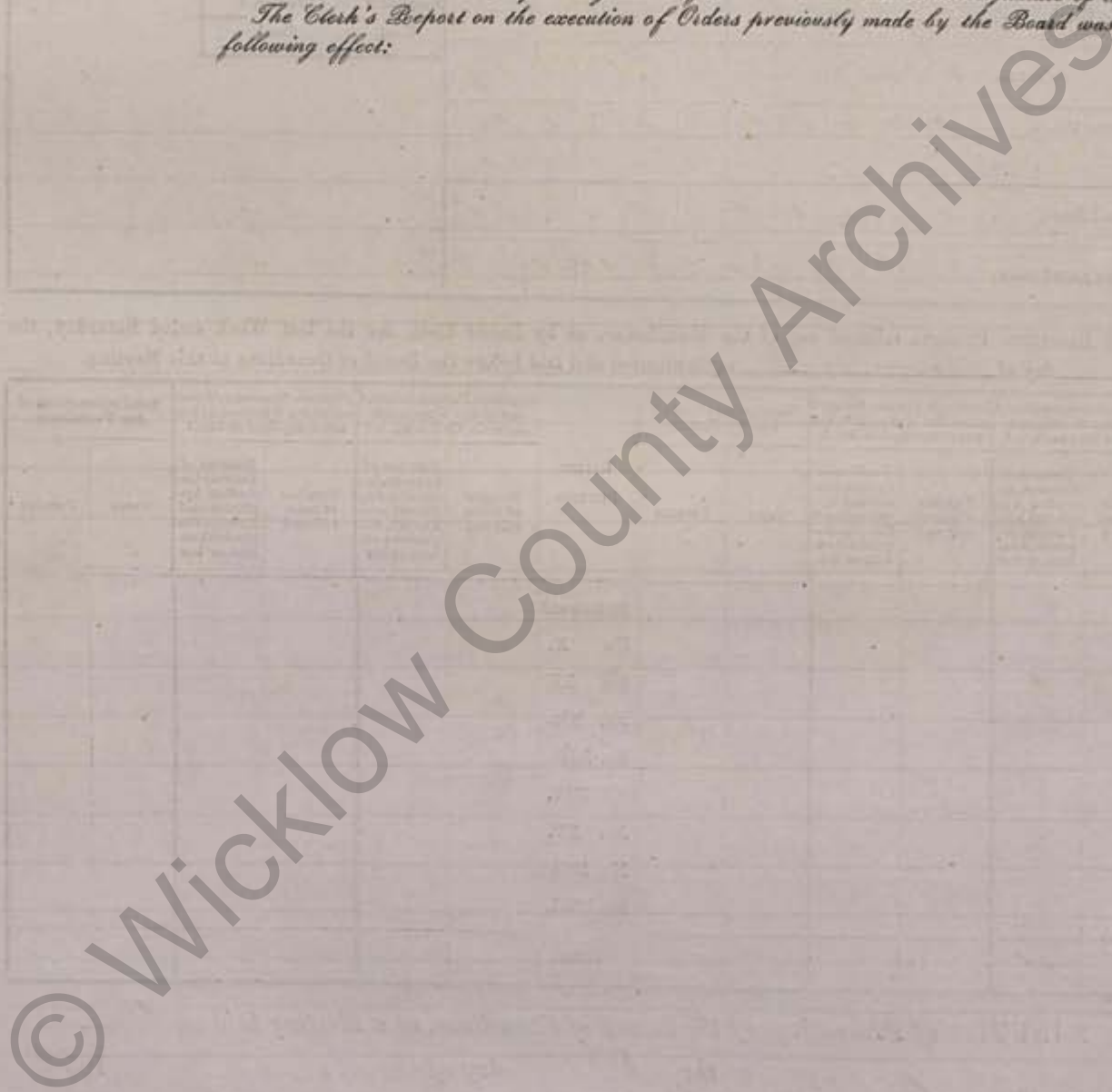

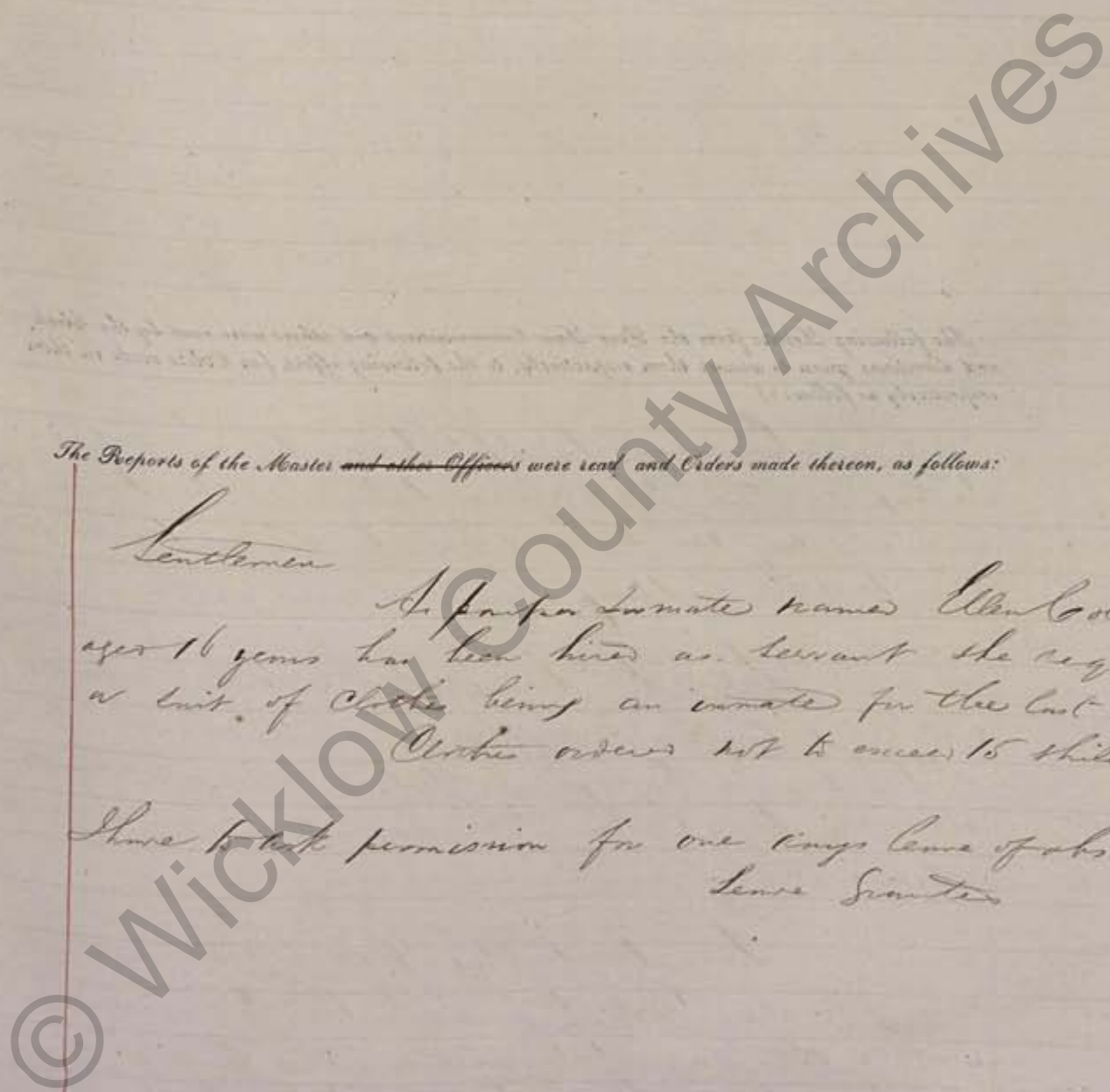

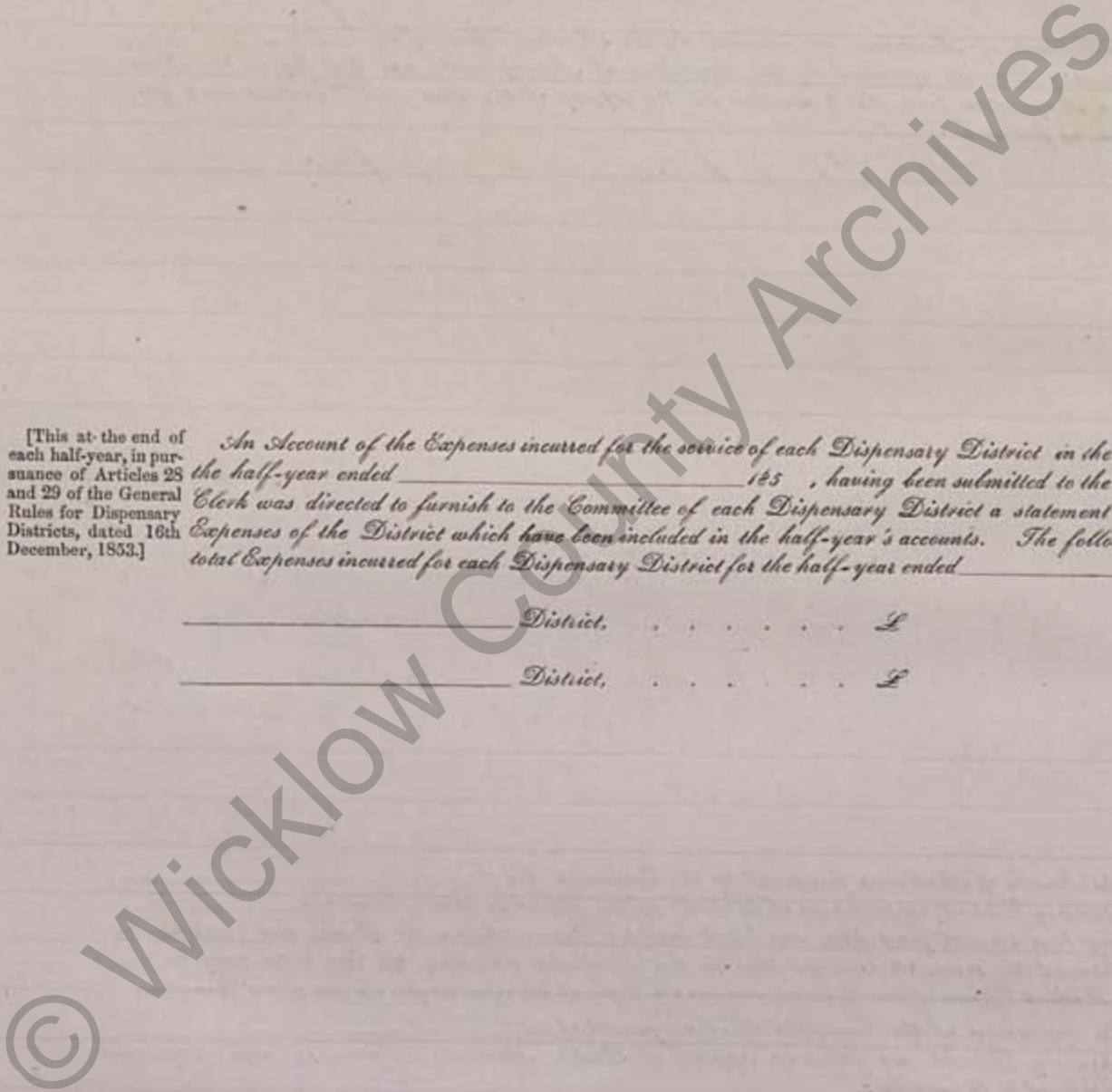

stating that

Acknowledging the receipt of the Clerk's Communication in reply to their letter of the 10<sup>th</sup> Instant, in reference to the number of Members returned for the Rathfriland District Committee, and stating that under Sec. 7 of the Medical Charities Act, the Board of Guardians cannot legally exceed the number of Members of the Committee fixed by the Commis.  
Signed Order, — The Guardians should therefore strike off the name of the last Elected Ratepayer on the Rathfriland Committee.

And stating in reply to the Clerk's query, that under the above Section an Elected Guardian not residing in the Union, is entitled to be a member of the Committee of a Dispensary District in the Union, provided he is the owner or occupier of property therein.

Under the same Section he is entitled not only to be a member of the Committee of the District in which he resides, but of each District in which he may be the owner or occupier of property.

The following Resolutions were passed at a Meeting of the Committee of Management of Rathfriland Dispensary District held on the 3<sup>rd</sup> of June 1858.

Resolved — That a press be supplied for the use of the Rathfriland Dispensary, and that a requisition for same be made to the Board of Guardians, the press to be of the following dimensions, viz. 7<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> feet high by 7<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> feet wide, with strong and good locks and hinges, the upper portion to be one foot deep the lower portion two feet eight inches.

Ordered that the Clerk shall write to the Hon<sup>ble</sup> Secy Rathfriland Dispensary Committee to <sup>(Signed)</sup> purchase a press and forward the Bill for payment to the Guardians.

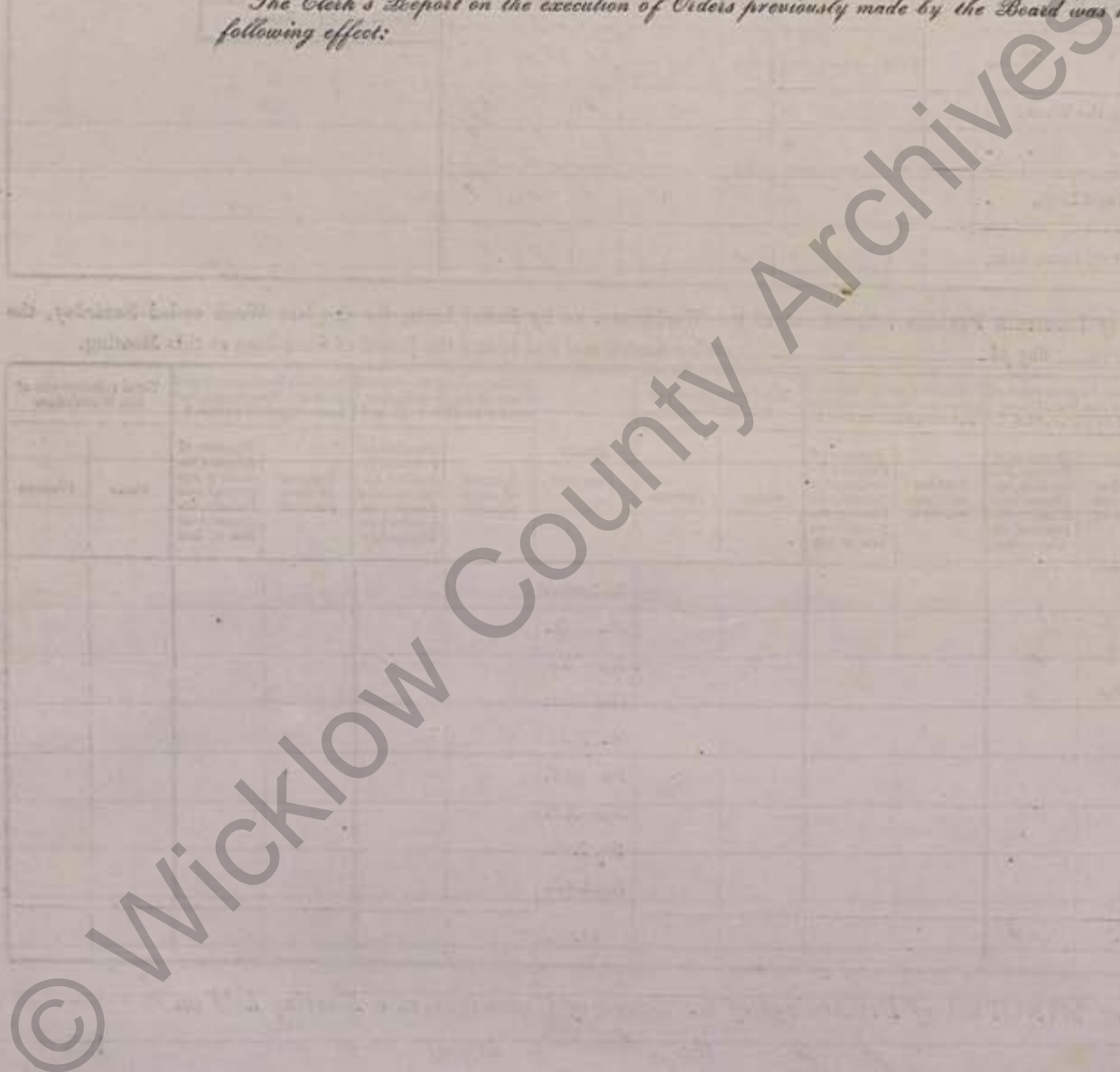

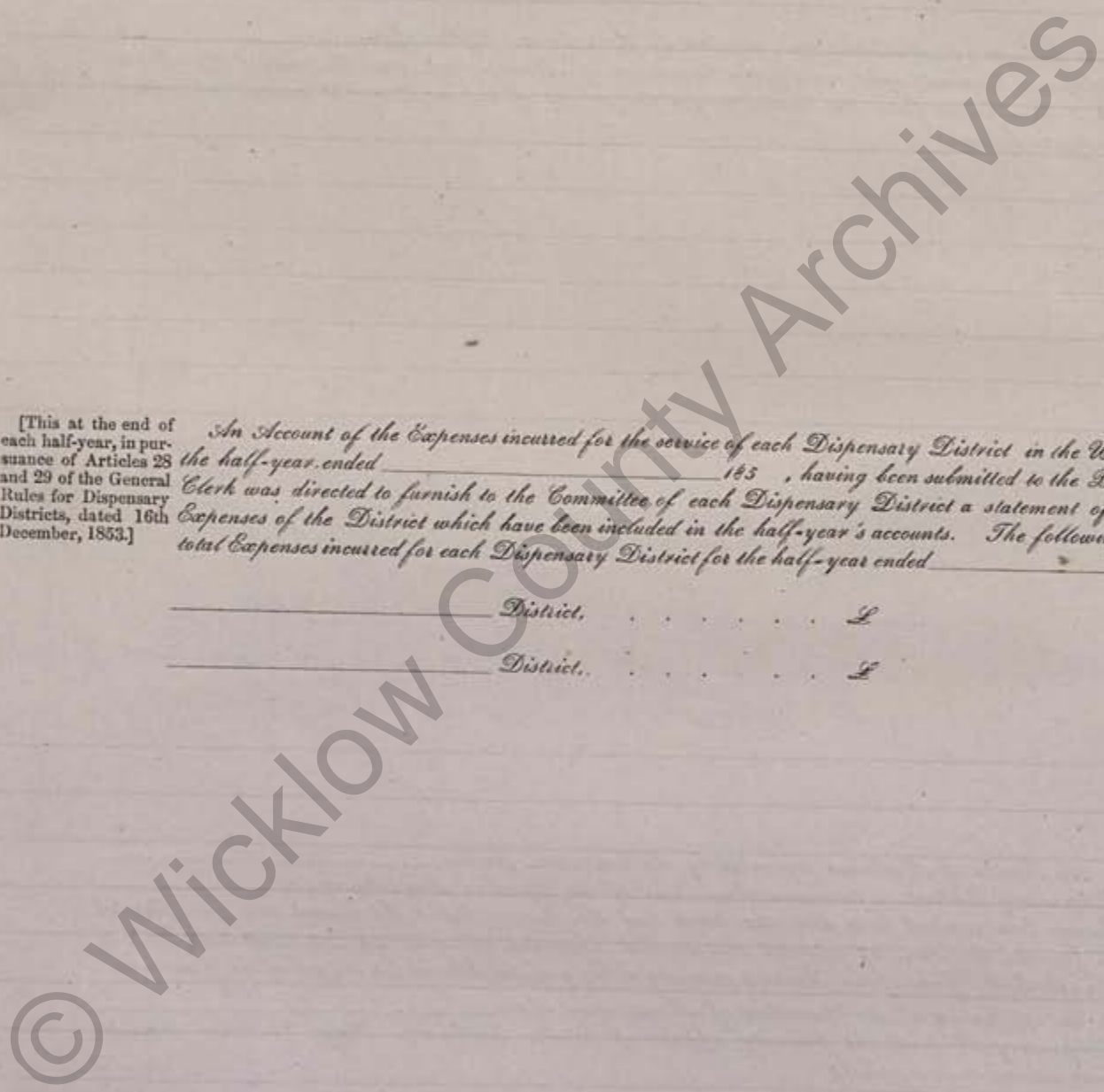

I have to observe in conclusion that the pupils of the several classes are not sufficiently questioned on the meaning of what they read by the Teacher, this is a serious omission and calls for immediate attention. We should ever bear in mind that the main principle of the National Education System is to lead the child to understand what he reads, by a careful systematic examination on the subject matter of each lesson.

Letter N<sup>o</sup> 23353 dated 11<sup>th</sup> Ultimo <sup>Ultimo</sup> with reference to an order made by the guardians on the 5<sup>th</sup> Ultimo directing the Master of the Workhouse to get some of the clay floors of the Workhouse laid with Bricks, the Commissioners suggest for the consideration of the guardians, whether it would not be more advisable to use Flooring Tiles instead of Bricks, as being more durable. The Commissioners at the same time request the attention of the guardians to the state of the drain from the Laundry which Mr Crawford Poor Law Inspector has reported to require repair.

In reply to the above the guardians have to inform the Commissioners, The brick floors are already laid down, and the drain from the Laundry is undergoing repair.

Letter N<sup>o</sup> 24206 dated 16<sup>th</sup> Ultimo sanctioning the appointment of Mrs Flower as Matron of the Workhouse at Liberty Pounds per Annum and Rations.

Letter N<sup>o</sup> 23353 Dated 18<sup>th</sup> Ultimo stating that the Commissioners have had before them a reply to their letter of the 4<sup>th</sup> Instant relative to the alteration proposed to be made in the dietary of the Workhouse inmates, and the Commissioners express their approval of the Guardians proposal to give Soup at the Dinner Meal to Classes 1 to 6 inclusive of the Healthy Inmates.

on Sunday and Thursday viz 2 pints to each Pauper in Classes 1 & 2 and one pint each to the Paupers in the remaining Classes.

The Commissioners at the same time suggest for the consideration of the Board of Guardians the propriety of consulting their Medical Officer, as to the expediency of giving soup to the Workhouse inmates on every day in the week or of increasing the number of days in which it is to be given.

In answer to the above the Doctor does not think it would be advisable to give soup oftener than three days in the week.

The Medical Officer suggested the propriety of increasing the quantity of Bread allowed to Class 4 of the inmates.

Proposed by Mr Bourke and seconded by Mr Michael Byrne Resolved that Class 4 of the Workhouse inmates be allowed 10 ounces of Brown Bread at dinner on those days that soup is given.

Circular Letter No. <sup>2014</sup> ~~2015~~ dated 22<sup>nd</sup> Instant Urging Calling on the Clerk for a Report of the present state of the potatoe crop if any be planted on the Workhouse site.

In reply to the above there is only a small quantity of potatoe planted on the Workhouse site which belong to the Officers of the Workhouse, they were a very good crop, about  $\frac{1}{2}$  of them are diseased.

Letter No. 25016 dated 25<sup>th</sup> Instant stating that the Commissioners perceive from the printed form of Minutes that there was no meeting of the Board of Guardians since the 5<sup>th</sup> Instant, in reference thereto the Commissioners call the attention of the Board to their letter of the 28<sup>th</sup> April last on the subject of the failure of the Guardians to meet regularly for the despatch of business.
