Read letter dated 16th December, 1921, No. 19525/21, from the Department of Local Government, enclosing copy of letter dated 10th instant received in that Department from John Burke, a patient in the Infirmary attached to Rathdrum Workhouse, and asking to have the Guardians' observations on the complaints made therein.

In his letter John Burke stated that he had been admitted on 2th July and had never been examined by a Doctor or treated for any complaint. He was sufferingfrom a bad stomach and when he complained to the Doctor no notice was taken of him. The Shillelagh inmates were being removed there now, so the place was overcrowded and the Doctor had ordered him out. He was not able to go out as he felt very weak and he demanded to be examined by a Doctor to prove his statements. He complained that the patients on milk diet, he was one himself, very seldom got it at night. On 23h, 29th and 30th November they got none, and on 1st December half a pint at night, and on several occasions when they got it, it was half water or sour. As far as he could see the Head Nurse was the Doctor; if patients made a complaint they were threatened to be put out. There was one particular old man in the Ward and the Head Murse nor Doctor never went near him, a poor, helpless old man. There was a Visiting Committee appointed by the Board of Guardians but they never visited the Hospital at all to see how the patients were treated. There was nothing there day after day but complaints.

The Master of the Workhouse stated that Burke had left the institution some time ago.



The Ministry asked to be furnished with the Guardians' observations on the matters refrred to.

She enclosed two newspaper extracts dealing with the matter. The Guardians informed the Union on 9th November that they had decided not to allow more than one guinea a week as payment to substitute in Nurse Redmond's case. without giving any reason, and to Nurse Redmond herself they replied on 1st inst. that the Guardians would not allow any larger sum than one guinea a week to substitutes for District Midwives granted leave. Yet, the writer stated, as you see by h the Press report they granted the temporary substitute in the Wicklow District two guineas a week, which amount was sanctioned by your Department. She asked that the Department point out to the Guardians that their attitude seemed inconsistent and ensure that Mrs Redmond procured her leave, of which she was in great need as she had no holiday for four years.




