## €80,000 Allocated to Wicklow Sports Clubs

Wicklow Sports & Recreation Partnership has announced the recipients of the Club Development Grant Scheme for 2024. A record number, 78 clubs, will receive financial support through this grant scheme for 2024.

One of the remits of Wicklow Sports & Recreation Partnership is to support sports clubs to provide opportunities for people to participate in organised sport and physical activity. This Club Development Grant Scheme aims to support initiatives that will lead to an increase in participation levels in sports clubs across Wicklow.

This particular scheme focused on:

- Training and education of club volunteers.
- Delivery of programmes or initiatives that will increase club membership.
- Small equipment purchases to facilitate increased membership.
- Youth development programmes to support the youth section of the club by training or upskilling youth members.
- Programmes and initiatives with a focus on inclusion of new communities, women and those with disabilities.

# 31 New Homes Officially Opened in County Wicklow

31 new homes in two housing estates in County Wicklow in Wicklow Town and Rathnew were officially opened by Cathaoirleach of Wicklow County Council, Cllr. Aoife Flynn Kennedy, alongside Darragh O'Brien TD, Minister for Housing, Local Government and Heritage.

In Liam Kavanagh Park, Wicklow, 6 two-bed homes and 4 three-bed homes, all of which will be allocated in the next few weeks, were officially unveiled.

Meanwhile in Merry Meeting Phase Two Rathnew, 16 two-bed homes and 5 three-bed homes were opened. These houses will also be allocated to new occupants over the course of the next few weeks.

The provision of these homes is among many schemes being developed in Wicklow under Wicklow County Council's Building and Supply Programme. All the houses are highly energy efficient, achieving a BER of A3. The majority of homes will also use high efficiency air to water heat pumps, resulting in low cost in use.

Availability of contractors to carry out re-let refurbishment work continues to be the major limiting factor in turning around Voids/Re-lets. The Council can only recoup a maximum of €11,000 per house from the Dept of Housing Local Government and Heritage, whereas the average cost of relets was €36,000 per house in 2022 and €31,000 per house in 2023.

The overall vacancy rate for rental properties (private and social) on Census night was 7%, so our vacancy rate is less than half the overall rate for a rental sector where Local Authorities account for only 29.8% of the properties. Also, Wicklow County Council's vacant units only account for 3.2% of the total number of vacant units in our county.

## **Housing Maintenance**

Planned Maintenance in the form of electrical remedial works is currently underway at Parkmore in Baltinglass. Further estates in West Wicklow will follow.

Gas boiler maintenance Framework Agreements are currently being tendered on <a href="www.supplygov.ie">www.supplygov.ie</a> for Baltinglass, Wicklow and Greystones MDs.

### **Private Rented Accommodation Regulation & Enforcement**

The Targeted Inspection programme on private rented accommodation continues. Housing For All requires 25% of all private rented properties to be inspected annually. This equates to approx. 1500 properties in Co. Wicklow every year. Target properties are selected using a Risk Based approach. The Council is responsible for enforcing the Housing (Standards for Rented Houses) Regulations 2019 (SI 137 of 2019). So far in 2024, the following Notices have been served by Wicklow County Council in relation to breaches of SI 137 of 2019:

# **Homeless HAP Place Finder**

The Homeless HAP Place finder provides assistance in:

- Seeking out potential properties suitable for households currently identified as homeless or at risk of homelessness.
- Liaising with specific households to establish their specific needs.
- Establishing relationships with local property agents and landlords; and,
- > Supporting those homeless households to (a) prevent the necessity to enter emergency accommodation or (b) to exit emergency accommodation and secure a tenancy.
- ➤ To date, 554 households (384 families & 163 singles) have been assisted under the Homeless HAP Scheme in Wicklow County Council from the inception on 1<sup>st</sup> October 2018 to 31<sup>st</sup> May 2024. (223 homeless cases, 308 prevention cases to date and 22 direct provision). 141 properties were sourced by WCC.

# Addressing Homelessness in Partnership with Approved Housing Bodies

### Homeless Supported Temporary Accommodation - Kilmantin Hill, Wicklow

Kilmantin Hill has 11 rooms to support persons either homeless, exiting a higher support facility, or in danger of becoming homeless.

There are 9 clients supported in the Kilmantin Hill facility, operated by Dublin Simon. There is continuous transition by the clients to suitable alternative accommodation.

A report is being undertaken at present to cost the refurbishment of the current rooms with a view to making them all ensuite. More details will be available over the coming months.

### Homeless Family Service - Fitzwilliam Road, Wicklow

Dublin Simon are engaged by Wicklow County Council to operate and manage the facility at Fitzwilliam Road, Wicklow as a Family Homeless Service. The building comprises of three 1-bed units, two 2-bed units, and two 3-bed units. Eleven families have now transitioned or are in the process of transitioning to a permanent home and the resulting vacancies are in the process of being occupied with families experiencing or in danger of homelessness.

It is envisaged that families will avail of the service for circa 6-months STA (Supported Temporary Accommodation) with key working support to enable families to transition from homelessness into Homeless HAP, or alternative longer-term accommodation.

## Homeless Supported Temporary Accommodation - San Remo, Bray

San Remo is operated by Dublin Simon and incorporates a service model whereby there are a number of emergency/cold weather initiative beds and Supported Temporary Accommodation Beds (STA). There is on site key working support linking in with clients.

The Neighbourhood Liaison Committee is now operational and meets monthly.

Bi-monthly meetings are held with Dublin Simon and Wicklow County Council staff.

# Homeless Supported Accommodation - Carraig Eden, Greystones

This facility provides 35 ensuite bedrooms with associated kitchens and common areas and is fully operational. Wicklow County Council run an in-reach service with the clients to support them as they continue their journey into more permanent accommodation.

## **Other Homeless Supported Accommodation**

Wicklow County Council owned properties in Wicklow, Bray, and Greystones, leased to Approved Housing Bodies, provide 12 units of low to medium supported accommodation targeted to the particular support needs of the clients. Six of these persons living in shared accommodation have now successfully moved into their forever homes and this in turn created space to move further people out of homelessness.

A homeless outreach service has been rolled out in Bray and is proving very successful.

### **Housing First**

Peter McVerry Trust has been appointed as the Housing First Programme Implementer for the Mid-East Region. Wicklow County Council is committed to working with them and has now reached and surpassed

the targets identified in the programme. Housing First recognises that a stable home provides the basis for recovery in other areas.

Properties will be provided by both Wicklow County Council and Peter McVerry Trust for the implementation of the programme.

Wicklow County Council has, to date, successfully accommodated 18 clients under Housing First. Other clients proposed for Housing First have been assessed by the team and are availing of key support work pending finalisation of sourcing of accommodation. The main issue facing this programme is the availability of 1-bed units in suitable locations with easy access to required services.

### Homeless Action Plan 2024 - 2026

### Community Recognition Fund (CRF) 2024

The Minister for Rural & Community Development, Heather Humphreys TD, together with her colleague Minister Joe O'Brien TD, have announced a further €50 million in national funding under the Community Recognition Fund to deliver projects over 2025 and 2026.

The Community Recognition Fund was first introduced last year to recognise the huge efforts made by communities in welcoming and supporting people coming to Ireland.

Wicklow County Council has been allocated €1,584,550 under the 2024 Community Recognition Fund.

The Community Recognition Fund 2024 aims to support the development of community infrastructure and facilities for the entire community, in recognition of the contribution being made by communities across the country in welcoming and hosting significant numbers of arrivals from Ukraine and other countries.

The scheme details set out that only areas which have high levels of new arrivals will be deemed eligible for this scheme.

Wicklow County Council sought expressions of interest for project proposals from community groups in areas where large numbers of citizens from other countries are currently living. Projects to be funded will be capital in nature, deliver medium to long term benefits for the communities in which they are located, and be capable of being delivered over the course of 2025 to 2026.

An information session was held online on 18th April 2024 at 5.30pm, with approximately 35 groups joining this online session.

A number of Expression of Interest Forms for proposed projects across the county, were received by the closing date of Friday, 10th May 2024. The proposed projects were submitted to the Department of Rural and Community Development, by Friday 31st May 2024 for final approval.

#### Pride of Place 2024

The Co-Operation Ireland Pride of Place Competition 2024 opened for nominations in May 2024. The purpose of the competition is to acknowledge the work being done every day by communities all over Ireland.

The winners of the National Pride of Place Competition will be announced at an Awards Ceremony in Monaghan on Saturday 2<sup>nd</sup> November 2024.

# **Local Community Safety Partnerships (LCSPs)**

Replacing the existing Joint Policing Committees, the LCSPs will bring all services and the community together at local authority level, to serve as a forum for discussion and decisions on community priorities.

Community safety is a broad concept that goes beyond just policing and crime. It's about people being and feeling safe in their communities, and it includes everything from visible Gardaí to safe places for children to play. Community safety needs a multi-agency approach, where services work together to deliver on the needs of individual communities.

Local Community Safety Partnership (LCSP) gives local people a stronger voice to identify and tackle community safety issues.

### **Local Community Safety Partnerships - Proposed Structure**

It is intended that membership of the Local Community Safety Partnership will include residents, community representatives, including representatives of youth, new communities and the voluntary sector, business and education representatives, relevant public services in the area, including HSE, Tusla, An Garda Síochána, the local authority and local councillors. As residents are central to identifying problems and solutions for their community, the partnerships will have a 51/49% split in favour of local residents and community representatives on the committee.



#### **Local Community Safety Plan**

The Local Community Safety Partnership will be responsible for developing a tailored and prioritised local community safety plan in conjunction with both community and public services. The intention is to build the capacity of local residents to enable them to engage meaningfully in the Local Community Safety Partnership and grow local community leadership and participation, and developing this will be a key aspect of the role of the Community Safety Coordinator. This will enable the Local Community Safety Partnership to function as a forum for dialogue between the community and service providers and should strengthen trust in the people providing services. The Local Community Safety Partnership will also work to identify specific initiatives where the community can support local services and An Garda Síochána in their community safety work, including outreach programmes.

An expression of interest will be sought shortly for the appointment of Chair of the new Local Community Safety Committee.

#### Launch of LEADER Programme 2023 - 2027

The LEADER programme for 2023 – 2027 was officially launched on at an event held by County Wicklow Partnership in Ballybeg House, Arklow on Thursday 19<sup>th</sup> June. The programme is implemented by the County Wicklow Partnership and aims to improve the quality of life and encourage diversification of economic activity in rural areas. It seeks to bring about positive change helping to support and sustain rural areas for the better.

## **CLÁR 2024**

Almost €9 million in fresh funding has been allocated to community and sports facilities nationwide under the 2024 CLÁR (Ceantair Laga Árd-Riachtanais) programme.

The CLÁR programme provides funding for small scale projects in rural areas that have experienced significant levels of population decline.

The programme is divided into three measures, which cover the different initiatives supported by the scheme.

Under **Measure 1** of the 2024 initiative, grants from €5,000 to €50,000 are being provided to support the development of community and sports facilities, youth clubs, playgrounds, sensory gardens, walking tracks and much more.

Measure 2 supports voluntary groups that provide free transport to people receiving cancer care and other treatment as well as Community First Response Support and Search and Rescue organisations. This year organisations providing a meals on wheels service are eligible to apply. The measure comes with maximum grants of €50,000 for a car and €100,000 for a bus.

**Measure 3** is designed to support offshore island communities, with maximum grants of €120,000 available for community transport projects and up to €50,000 available for amenities projects.

Applications for Measures 1 & 3 closed on 19th June, and Measure 2 on 5th June.

Measure 1 is administered by Local Authorities in consultation with local communities and applications will only be accepted directly from Local Authorities. Measure 2 and Measure 3 are administered directly by the Department of Rural and Community Development.

Areas targeted under the CLÁR Programme are parts of counties: Carlow, Cavan, Clare, Cork, Donegal, Galway, Kerry, Kilkenny, Laois, Limerick, Longford, Louth, Mayo, Meath, Monaghan, Offaly, Roscommon, Sligo, Tipperary, and Waterford, Westmeath, Wicklow and all of County Leitrim.

#### **Community Awards Scheme 2024**

As part of its commitment to supporting local community development, Wicklow County Council operates an annual Community Award Scheme. The fund for 2024 will be available as grant aid to successful community groups and local organisations wishing to undertake community projects in their area. There is a maximum grant amount of €500 per organisation for small projects and group running costs. Application assessments have been completed, and applicants have been notified directly. Arrangements are currently being made to pay the successful applicants.

### Action 3.8 Appoint Healthy Age Friendly Homes Co-ordinator & Rollout Wicklow Programme

Healthy Age Friendly Homes (HAFH) Programme is a support coordination programme that aims to enable older people to age in place and reduce the need to transfer to long-term residential care. The Programme is a collaboration between the Department of Health and the Department of Housing and Local Government. It is funded by the Department of Health and operated by Meath County Council, on behalf of all Local Authorities.

The service is designed to enable older people to remain living in their own home for longer. The local coordinator undertakes home visits to older people living in the community, where a needs assessment is carried out, looking at four key areas of supports: housing, health, community/social supports, and technology. Home visits from the local co-coordinator are available to anyone aged 65+years. The rollout of the programme will commence in January 2024.

#### **HAFH Coordinator Activity**

Assisting and empowering the programme participants with applications for housing adaptation grants, accessing community and health support services are some of the activities the coordinator is engaged in. Facilitating use of assistive technology such as falls detectors. Introducing participants to falls prevention techniques, to prevent avoidable hospital admission as a consequence of falls.

### Older People's Council, Executive Group - Meetings and Representation

The Older People's Council (OPC) met in the Brockagh Centre on Thursday, 13<sup>th</sup> June 2024 to discuss the following – over 70`s driving licence, Travel and Health Insurance, Transportation and GP Appointments.

The OPC Executive is planning for wider engagement with older people across the county and recruitment of more members of the OPC this year.

### **Age Friendly Ireland Committee**

The Age Friendly Ireland launched The Age Friendly Ambassadors` Day in Slane, Co. Meath on the 23<sup>rd</sup> May 2023 where the Ambassadors highlighted how older individuals aged 65 and older in Ireland are redefining ageing. They noted that older people are more active and engaged than previous generations, with significant shifts in societal attitudes towards health, exercise and socialisation.

### **Disability Inclusion Steering Group**

The Disc Committee met on the 30<sup>th of</sup> May 2024 to discuss "Make Way Day" Campaign. This Campaign is to make people aware of issues that people with a disability face - for example parking a car up on the footpath where a person in a wheelchair cannot pass by and have to go out on the road to continue on their journey.

#### **Couch to Parkrun Programme**

The Couch to parkrun programme commenced on 3<sup>rd</sup> June in Rathnew and will continue twice a week on Monday and Wednesday mornings. 20 participants will complete this tutor led 7-week programme finishing with the Avondale parkrun on Saturday 20<sup>th</sup> July.

#### Men's Health Awareness Week

Men's Health Awareness week took place between  $10^{th} - 16^{th}$  June. Healthy Wicklow collaborated with the HSE to facilitate a workshop on the  $12^{th}$  of June in the Pastoral Hall Wicklow Town on this year's theme 'Know your Numbers' and the key message to everyone is that men's health counts.

#### **Unwind with Plants**

This 4-week summer social and therapeutic horticulture programme with commence on 13<sup>th</sup> June in Shillelagh Courthouse. Over the four weeks, participants will learn how to propagate indoor plants, design greeting cards printed from flower petals, enjoy Mandala making and grow their own salad leaves all year round.

### Client engagements

### **Process Updates**

 The LAIT continues to facilitate linking in relevant support services for new arrivals in IPAS centres in Co. Wicklow. The LAIT initially conducts assessments and provides support to newly arrived residents and then provides relevant information to the services to facilitate targeted supports.

#### Advice and Information Clinics

The advice and information clinics being hosted by the LAIT are concentrating on new arrivals, both individuals and families, within the International Protection Application process.

For each new arrival the LAIT meets with, an initial advice and information session is conducted covering the following basic rights and entitlements.

- Orientation to County Wicklow and the local community
- Providing information on the International Protection Application process
- Supporting access to the Daily Expenses Allowance
- Medical card applications
- Childcare and school placements information and referral to REALT and the IPAS EWO
- Urgent health referrals to HSE Social Inclusion
- Links to KWETB for English classes and education/training advice
- Registration for volunteering

For new family arrivals in Wicklow Town, we have also agreed that the team will make automatic referrals to the Wicklow Child and Family Project for ongoing support.

Support with employment, volunteering, and health continue to be the main issues raised by residents during the clinics.

# **Specific Purpose Clinics**

It has been recognised by the LAIT as well as several other stakeholders, that certain specific purpose clinics are beneficial to residents in IPAS centres. A medical card specific purpose clinic was hosted in one West Wicklow centre in May and the plan is to continue to include these as part of our client engagement, and to examine what other topics would support new arrivals, such as support to create MyGovID online accounts in order to access government services, and to provide overviews of education and other training opportunities in Ireland.

#### **AOB**

An IPAS centre in West Wicklow agreed to host the second coffee morning in June for networking opportunities with the other centre managers from Co. Wicklow. The first one hosted by the LAIT team in County Buildings was well attended and will now rotate among the centres, as and when agreed within the group.

### Co. Wicklow Public Participation Network (PPN)

Local Elections: Wicklow PPN facilitated the following over recent weeks- Meet the Candidate webinars, Newsletter Election Special, local press releases, social media posts. This encouraged people to register to vote, find out about the candidates and engage with election process.

Environmental Network: Continuing collaboration between WCC Climate Action Team & PPN Environmental Reps from March Environment Event.

Disability & Inclusion Steering Committee (DISC): Queries shared from Committee members with Disability Officer regarding transport and travel issues in Co. Wicklow ahead of Officer's meeting with WCC engineers.

Wicklow PPN celebrated its 10-year anniversary on June 15<sup>th</sup> at Festina Lente with its Secretariat, staff and all those who have been involved in supporting the PPN over past decade.

Consultations: N81 Hollywood Rural Traffic Calming and Bus Stop Public Consultation, Part 8 - Merrymeeting View, Affordable Housing Survey, Blessington Greenway Scheme, Identification of Bathing Waters 2024, County Wicklow Heritage Plan.

16 new groups joined Wicklow PPN in May. This brings total membership to 462 groups.

Wicklow PPN new Strategic Plan to be launched at 10-year celebration event on June 15th.

Pre-draft consultation closed for the new Wicklow Town - Rathnew Local Area Plan closed on 28 September 2023 with 84 submissions received. A well-attended public information day was held on 14 September 2023. All valid submissions have been reviewed and considered and a draft plan is being prepared. Once the draft plan is prepared it will go out on public consultation for 6 weeks with submissions invited from everyone. It is hoped that the draft plan will commence display in Q3 2024.

Consultants have been appointed to carry out the SEA and AA for the LAP and they are continuing to work on the SEA/ AA work. All other studies / assessments are intended at this time to be carried out in-house.

### Residential Zoned Land Tax (RZLT)

The Government's Housing For All – A New Housing Plan for Ireland has introduced a new tax to activate vacant land for residential purposes as a part of the 'Pathway to Increasing New Housing Supply'. The draft RZLT maps for lands liable in 2025 was published on 01 February 2024. Submissions were invited on the draft maps up to 01 April 2024 with 9 submissions received. # **Vacant Site Levy**

This programme is still ongoing and is affected by the proposed deferral of the RZLT. As liability to the RZLT is now proposed to be deferred for one year, it is considered appropriate to maintain provisions in legislation for the management and continued charging of the vacant site levy in respect of land which is identified on the register. This will continue to facilitate imminent placements on the register, conclusion of appeals and to facilitate the issuing of demands in relation to the levy for the period to the end of 2024. This will ensure that the use of the levy as an active land management measure will continue until the RZLT is in effect.

**County Heritage Plan (CHP):** The Heritage Council have approved a funding allocation of €57,000 for projects under the County Heritage Plan Fund 2024. The following projects have commenced; County Heritage Plan Review, Glendalough Community Archaeology Project and Wicklow Community Archaeology Service.

**Irish Community Archive Network (iCAN)** – Five new community groups have signed up to the *Our Wicklow Heritage* network and are currently receiving training in setting up their digital archives. National network meeting held 24<sup>th</sup> May hosted by Cork County Council Heritage Officer, training for Wicklow groups scheduled for 11<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup> June.

**Archaeology:** Community Monuments Fund- CMF 2024. Six projects have been a successful in receiving funding allocations as per project applications prepared by the Heritage Office and submitted to National Monuments Service. All grants accepted and projects are in early stages of commencement.

**Built Heritage Capital Funds (Architecture):** A funding allocation of €101,000 has been received in respect of 16 projects shortlisted for county Wicklow under the Built Heritage Investment Scheme (BHIS). Additionally, four projects have been successful under the Historic Structures Fund (HSF) as follows; Coolattin House €171,000; Clermont House €171,000; Former Post Office, Shillelagh €20,000 and Vernacular house at Rosebank, Avoca €10,000.

### **E-Planning Project**

The eplanning has now been in place for just over one year, it went live on 17<sup>th</sup> April 2023 and for the year up to 16<sup>th</sup> April 2024, during this time we received a total of 1,437 applications of which 744 were received through the new eplanning portal and 693 were received online, 50.62% in the first year were received online.

For the **month of May 2024**, a total of 97 planning applications were received of which 39.18% were hard copy applications and **60.82% were received online**.

From 1<sup>st</sup> January 2024 to 31<sup>st</sup> May 2024 a total of 540\* applications were received of which 44.07% were hard copy applications and 55.93% were received online. (\*excludes hard copy Section 254 licences as these cannot be applied for through eplanning)

# **Economic and Rural Development**

### **Town Regeneration**

### **Blessington Town Centre First Masterplan**

Blessington is a pathfinder town and is the first to receive funding for a Town Centre First Masterplan. The masterplan will provide Blessington with a clear framework to positively develop the town now and into the future. The implementation of the TCF plan is at the planning stage. RRDF funding will fund the redesign of the Main Street and Market Square and bring those projects to a shovel ready stage where they can be submitted for funding for Category 1 RRDF.

**Newtownmountkennedy** has been announced under Phase 2 as one of the next 26 towns approved to develop Town Centre First Plans. Funding support of €30,000.00 will be given to the project.

### **Funding Schemes**

# **Town Centre First – Suite of Supports**

Newtownmountkennedy have recently been approved for funding of € 30,000.00 under **Town Centre First**Measure 2 Suite of Supports. This Town Centre First Plan must be completed, and reports submitted to the Department by 5<sup>th</sup> September 2025.

Baltinglass, Rathdrum and Kilcoole have been selected for funding of €10,000.00 for each of these towns under the **Town Centre First Town Team Support Fund – Measure 1.** This funding can be used to establish town teams where they are already not established or at an early stage of development. All projects under this measure must be completed by 15/11/2024

The Town Centre First Measure 3 Application closed on the 8<sup>th</sup> April. Two applications have been submitted for this Project funding.

- 1. Blessington measures to include enhancement to the Square with tree planting and rain garden, spaces for dining and fixed seating.
- 2. Wicklow town Further enhancement at the Black Castle area to encourage more tourism and attractions for locals with installation of picnic tables, seating and a sculpture park.

#### **Thrive**

Under the new Thrive – Town Centre First Heritage Revival Scheme Strand 1, two applications were submitted on the 5<sup>th</sup> April for Bray and Wicklow Town/Rathnew. The aim of these projects is to enhance and develop existing Town Realms under the Town Centre First approach.

The Town Centre First Heritage Revival Strand 2 for Bray Courthouse and Heritage Centre application was submitted to Thrive on the 3rd May.

## **Town and Village Renewal Scheme 2023**

Wicklow Co Council has been awarded €725,000 from the Department of Rural and Community Development under Town & Village Renewal Scheme 2023. The Projects selected were Kirikee, Glenmalure for work on their Community Centre to include renovation of the roof, windows ceilings and walls. Lacken to renovate the old schoolhouse to be used as a community centre to include café and community shop and a small heritage section and Wicklow Towns Murrough BMX pump track to develop into a best- in–class asphalt covered pump track for all ages and abilities.

#### **Town Teams**

We currently have four Town Teams, Arklow, Wicklow, Greystones and Blessington.

Discussions are continuing on the future establishment of a Bray Town Team.

The teams work closely with Town Regeneration, attending meetings and giving information on funding and grants available to Town Teams.

# Rural and Urban Regeneration Development Fund Grant Applications Steering Group for the Progression of URDF and RRDF Projects

The Chief Executive has established an interdisciplinary team for the progression of Wicklow County Councils URDF (Urban Regeneration and Development Fund) and RRDF (Rural Regeneration and Development Fund) projects. The group meet monthly to streamline the advancement of RRDF and URDF projects along with a sub-group that will meet fortnightly and report to the steering group. This is a significant step in setting up the structures for town regeneration in the County.

These groups continue to meet fortnightly and monthly for discussions on updates.

**Blessington RRDF:** Blessington has been awarded over €1m funding under the Rural Regeneration Development Fund (RRDF) to be used for the regeneration of Blessington Town Centre, the development of plans for public realm works, the redevelopment of a vacant/derelict property to create an eHub and a Visitor Centre for the forthcoming Blessington Lakes Greenway.

**Baltinglass RRDF:** The costings for Baltinglass Gateway to Southwest Wicklow has come in over budget on both the public realm and the Courthouse refurbishment. The proposals have been revised and the necessary technical plans are complete in order for the works to commence. Works on the Public Park and

playground are underway. Application for further funding on this project was made to the Department on the 7<sup>th</sup> February 2024. However, the submission was not successful.

**Newtownmountkennedy RRDF:** The project is under review at present due to revisions necessary to the public realm, due to contested issues regarding the design of the public realm. Following the necessary revisions, it is hoped that agreement will be reached, the plans will be signed off and submitted for Category 1 funding.

### **URDF: Urban Regeneration Development Fund**

**URDF Call 3:** The URDF announced recently that Wicklow will receive €2.5 million to assist long term vacancy and dereliction. Four properties have been chosen (two in Arklow and two in Wicklow) and the process has commenced in acquiring these properties. An information gathering notice has been published on a number of the properties seeking information to be directed to the Council.

Another property has been identified in Arklow and we are now awaiting approval from the department to start the process of acquiring this property.

**Bray Harbour Improvements:** A tender will be issued when the URDF funding has been confirmed for the next phase of the project. A business case has been sent to DHL&H and a tender brief is being prepared for the procurement of engineering consultancy services to produce detailed designs, environmental reports and an application to An Bord Pleanala for the proposed works.

### **Tourism**

Wicklow County Council Tourism Office continues to promote County Wicklow as a destination not only to domestic visitors but also on the international market using a range of tools and activities. See below some of the actions that were delivered during May and upcoming events for June.

**Wicklow Ambassadors Blogs:** Over the past couple of months, the rate of visitors completing the Wicklow Passport has increased with many people collecting 15 or more stamps. **Wicklow Cycling Routes:** Thirty road cycling routes have been identified around the county. The routes vary in length and difficulty and have been designed to help package Wicklow as a fantastic cycling destination from family cycles to long mountain routes for elite cyclists. Those routes are sorted by area and six cycling hubs have been identified. The North-East Wicklow hub has been released and includes four different routes that include Bray, Greystones, Delgany, Kilcoole, Newcastle, Newtownmountkennedy, Enniskerry and Roundwood.

#### **Abbey Grounds, Wicklow**

Work continues on the Fáilte Ireland Destination Towns project at Abbey Grounds. Following procurement, the contractor for the Coach House has commenced work on the building. The other elements of the project, including the amphitheatre and landscaping will run parallel.

#### Glendalough Masterplan and Wicklow Visitor Orientation Study

Following on from the launch of the Glendalough and Wicklow Mountains National Park Visitor Experience and Management Masterplan, work has begun on the implementation of the Plan. A Steering Group has been established, which is chaired by the Chief Executive of Wicklow County Council.

A Working Group comprising representatives from all stakeholders has also been formed and has commenced work on short term actions for 2024, along with longer term actions also. As community consultation and participation is a central tenet of the masterplan, a Local Advisory Group has been established to keep the local community informed and ensure their input to the process.

Improvements to traffic management and the additional car parking spaces provided with kind permission of the Brockagh Resource Centre and Laragh GAA have been welcomed by both visitors and locals alike. Directional signage has been erected to ensure an easier flow of traffic and this is supplemented by a dedicated social media campaign advising visitors where to access car parks.

## **Special Projects**

**Greystones Enterprise Hub**: A budget for fit-out and operations and maintenance has been received from Cushman and Wakefield and is being reviewed prior to final works to ready the building for occupation. **Sites on Mill Road, Greystones:** Progress on the Mill Road sites is on hold pending PRA confirmation of site registration.

Carnew Remote Working Hub: An initial meeting and site visit with the design contractor has taken place. An agreement on a preliminary design is due in July with a final design agreement expected in mid-August. Where Part VIII planning permission is required, an application will be made before the end of the year.

Marketing Plan: MarketingCoach are working with hub owners to produce marketing materials for the Marketing Plan for County Wicklow, highlighting the availability of Remote Working Hubs and Broadband Connection Points following the Marketing Plan that has been agreed recommending a campaign idea "Choose Wicklow".

#### Offshore Renewable Energy

The Offshore Renewable Energy (ORE) Network continues to meet regularly and engage with the offshore renewable energy companies who are developing proposals off the coast of County Wicklow. A plan for 2024 based around three work-streams (skills, ports/harbours, and supply chain) has been agreed.

#### **Skills Strategy**

The draft Skills Strategy for County Wicklow has been presented to the Economic Development and Enterprise Support SPC and will be included on the agenda for consideration at the Council meeting on 1<sup>st</sup> July. The Skills Taskforce will then begin implementation of the actions contained within the County Wicklow Skills Strategy.

# **Food and Beverage Strategy**

**Wicklow Naturally**: Social media activities are being driven by the new social media co-ordinator. A part-time network and events co-ordinator is also in place with the next Wicklow Naturally members networking event scheduled for the end of June/early July.

Wicklow County Council has been awarded grant funding from the Department of Agriculture, Food and the Marine to support Destination Wicklow, a project focusing on telling the story of Wicklow Naturally members and their products. Preparation work on this project has commenced.

The three beaches in County Wicklow awarded the Blue Flag are: Brittas Bay North & South and Greystones South. After an absence of 4 years Arklow South Beach regained the Green Coast Award.

The draft remediation plan has been presented to the court and has been approved in part. Tender Documents for the Outlets for Material excavated from the site and also for the main contractor are presently being prepared.

Currently, this work primarily involves making the mines sites safe, by replacing fencing and making safe access to locations that require sampling and monitoring. The contract has been awarded to complete the fencing around Cronebane and Tigroney sections of the Mines. Monitoring and repair works to existing fencing continues.

Planning Application and CPO has been approved by An Bord Pleanála. Byrne Looby Partners Ltd., (now known as Ayesa) has been appointed to carry out the detailed design and tender stage of the project. Site Investigation and Archaeological Investigations will be carried out in 2024.

### Cruinniu na nÓg

On Saturday 15<sup>th</sup> June, just over 2,000 children and young people from all over County Wicklow participated in our 12 townland hubs, including those from coastal areas to the mountains and rural villages, enjoying a day of free creative activity as part of Cruinniú na nÓg.

An initiative of the Creative Ireland Programme, it was developed and delivered by Wicklow County Council's Arts Office in partnership with many local arts and community organisations. A wide range of artforms were represented with workshops themed around dance, movie making, costuming for film and television, music performances, composition, illustration, nature art, environmentally themed art and much more.

Highlights for the day included the performances by new communities as part of the Baltinglass Festival Programme in the Community Garden, with children from Ukraine performing in Flowers for Ukraine, children of various nationalities from Kippure Lodge performing, and children drumming from Slaney Court in the town of Baltinglass.

Also featured were the Irish Dancers from Gohery School of Irish Dancing and workshops from ten local professional artists on the day, who worked providing workshops to the hundreds of young people who took part.

In Rathdrum, children from third class in the three primary schools of St. Saviours National School, Rathdrum Boys National School and Our Lady's Girls National School showcased their work 'Beyond the Trees' in a premiere performance of a climate themed work which they composed with Music Generation Wicklow and composer Tom Lane and visual artist Louise Shearer.

In Greystones at Tiglin Coolnagreina, children and young people of Ukraine worked with Rhyme Island to create their own unique rap and concert performance.

Several workshops took place across the county in Library Service branches; the Courthouse Arts Centre and Mermaid Arts Centre had paper play and the Beatles Hits for kids, with stellar performances also by children and young people in Arklow, supported by Arklow Music and Arts.

The budget was 30,000.00 and was funded by Creative Ireland.

#### Film Awards

Launched by Laura Whitmore from Bray earlier in April 2024, the new Film Award Scheme an initiative of Wicklow County Arts Office and Wicklow Screen Office of Wicklow County Council and supported by Clermont Screen Hub received x applications. Shortlisting was held at Ardmore Studios overseen by independent consultant Brian O'Regan of Arts Leaders and panellists Jade of the National Talent Academy and Dave of x. x number of these applicants were called to a pitching interview which took place in Clermont Wicklow County Campus on May 31<sup>st</sup>. The panel were supported on this occasion by Arts Officer Jenny Sherwin and Screen Officer John Powderly. Following rigorous deliberation, two short films and their creative teams were selected. There will as intended therefore be two awards of 15,000.00 made available to these applicants. The formal internal process is currently underway and once that is complete, with all applicants informed of the outcome, the announcement will be made public.

### **Sing In Wicklow Awards**

The Sing in Wicklow Award supports collective singing across County Wicklow. Specifically created to advance the professional development of choirs, singing groups, and musical directors, the scheme aims to extend valuable opportunities for community participation in choral singing.

The Sing in Wicklow Award forms part of a wider set of actions created by Wicklow County Council and funded by Creative Ireland to support the existing community choral infrastructure and enhance participation levels under the Creative Wicklow Strategy 2023 – 2027.

A callout for applications was circulated on 16<sup>th</sup> April 2024 with a deadline for receipt of applications 10th May 2024. A total of fourteen applications were received.

The applications were assessed by independent consultant Katherine Zeserson and supported in a non-scoring capacity by Jenny Sherwin, Arts Officer.

The Arts Office has supported a number of initiatives which will take to the stage for Kalaidescope.

These are all supported through our funding arrangement with Music Generation Wicklow. Our joint project – the Kippure Lodge Community Choir a young people's project are just one of a number of the groups who will take to the stage each night of the Festival between 5pm and 8pm.

### **West Wicklow Festival**

West Wicklow Festival presented a bumper line up of classical music performances in Russborough House and Blessington. Another Arts Office Strategic youth project was part of the WWF with Peter and the Wolf performances for 220 children and families with craft outreach workshops taking place within it. WCC also fund WWF through our annual Arts Festival Awards. This is the biggest arts festival in West Wicklow.

### **Dunlavin Festival of Arts**

Dunlavin Arts Festival is a valuable community led arts festival event held in Dunlavin. 2024 marked the 40<sup>th</sup> year of the Festival, a significant milestone for the Festival and possibly the longest running arts festival not only in West Wicklow but all of County Wicklow. The Festival was funded through the Arts Festival Scheme but also a purchase of an Artwork by Trevor Geoghan, a recently deceased County Wicklow professional artist was bought as part of the WCC Art Collection to support the 40<sup>th</sup> year of the Festival.

#### Strategic Project Award Scheme

The Strategic Project Award Scheme is eligible for application by independent artist or collaborating artists. This annual Scheme will open slightly later for application this year due to resources, in July. Each year approximately 100,000.00

is awarded to 8 or 9 applicants to deliver high quality developmental initiatives which support the implementation of the Council's Arts Strategy.

### **Culture Night**

Culture Night this year is on Friday September 20<sup>th</sup>, 2024. This National Initiative has been presented in Wicklow for 14 years now and is well developed. Thousands of people access the Arts Office programme throughout the county on this night each year and all for free. Preparation has begun for the presentation of the 2024 programme in June and will continue up until September.

### **Creative Places Baltinglass**

### Rathcoran Residency 22<sup>nd</sup> June:

The 'Community Planting & Street Feast Festival Day 'at Rathcoran housing estate took place on 25<sup>th</sup> May the final day of this residency will be a community day on June 22<sup>nd</sup>. Artist and permaculture expert Suzie Cahn lead a community planting and participatory workshops. The community residents enjoyed participating in the events laid on and brought along dishes native to their countries of origin to share with others.

### **Baltinglass Sings Community Choir 21st June:**

### **Final Year Creative Places Baltinglass:**

The final year of the Creative Places Baltinglass 3 year programme was awarded on June 19<sup>th</sup>. Further to the application made by the Arts Office, WCC will receive the maximum award of 150,000.00 under the Scheme.

### **Creative Places Arts Council National Review Meeting Baltinglass**

On June 27<sup>th</sup> Amanda Boiling an associate consultant working for the Arts Council will visit Baltinglass as part of their national evaluative process. Amanda will meet with four different groups of stakeholders, artists, residents and the steering group. This is to inform the learning on the National Creative Places Programme with a view to gathering the learnings of Baltinglass to contribute to the data profile. It is likely that there is continuation funding for Creative Places Baltinglass and other Creative Places Programmes which will be influenced by this evaluative process.

### <u>Irish Writers Centre Words Ireland National Literature Mentorship Scheme Writing Mentorship Awards for Wicklow</u>

There were two recipients of the Words Ireland IWC National Literature Mentorship Scheme supported by Wicklow County Council in 2024. The successful applicants were Ali McGuire and Ben McGuire.

Ali McGuire writes fiction, poetry, and essays centred on what it means to be human, particularly a woman. She was a 2024 IWC Novel Fair finalist, has been featured in The Independent's New Irish Writing, and made the Fish Short Story and Poetry longlists in 2023. She holds a first-class master's in creative writing from DCU. Ali lives way down in South County Wicklow with kids, dogs, and a very patient husband.

Ben McGuire won the Coast to Coast-to-Coast Journal Prize in 2023, and the resulting pamphlet, published in Liverpool, is *Luke the World: Elegies for a Brother*. Poems of his have appeared in *Poetry Ireland Review, Stand* and *The Irish Times*, and been commended in the Troubadour Prize. He lives in Bray.

The value of the mentorship is €1,500.00 for each writer.


### Little Library Bag Initiative for Incoming Junior Infants, September 2024


### Cruinniú na Nóg







### **Greystones Library Drawing Workshop**

### **Archives & Genealogy Service**

### Cruinniú na nÓg in the County Archives

Creative Writing and Illustration Workshop with author Carmel Kelly and illustrator Jimmy Burns. The children learned about writing and drawing a book for young readers, based on the new children's book about Wicklow Gaol. Participants were invited to create a "Wanted Poster" and explore the history of Wicklow Gaol in this engaging and interactive workshop. The workshop is based on the recent publication by Carmel Kelly for the County Archives entitled *Wicklow Gaol: Three Centuries of Incredible Irish History*. Developed as part of Wicklow County Council's *Decade of Centenaries* programme and supported by the Department of Tourism, Culture, Arts, Gaeltacht, Sport & Media, the book has been distributed to all Wicklow library branches and each County Wicklow primary school has received a classroom set both in English agus as Gaelige. The author Carmel Ui Cheallaigh and illustrator Jimmy Burns have presented workshops in the libraries of each MD.

### Digitisation programme

The digitised minute book of the Wicklow Borough Corporation is now available to access on Wicklow.ie. The minute book dates from 1662 to 1707 and is one of the earliest items in the County Archives. Written in the old secretary hand style, it has been transcribed into modern English and this transcription is also on Wicklow.ie. Local historian Therese Hicks produced the transcription for the County Archives along with an essay placing the minute book in historical context. The minute book opens a door into the world of Wicklow Town as it developed in the 17th and 18th centuries, detailing the proceedings of the meetings of the town burgesses.

#### **Exhibitions**

Arklow library are currently presenting the County Archives exhibition *Wicklow Gaol Comrades: A Civil War Autograph Book*. Based on the publication of the same name, which was a joint Decade of Centenaries project between Wicklow and Wexford County Archives, the exhibition explores the stories of the men held in Wicklow Gaol during the Civil War. An accompanying video featuring interviews with the families of these men will also be shown.

### **Wicklow Coast Blueway**

The Wicklow Coast Blueway project is moving towards the second stage of the accreditation process with the current accreditation mainly reliant on provider-based activities. Blueway promotion, links and signage being developed. Project completion due in March 2025, with works at various stages of completion on the selected Blueway Nodes:

Greystones – Accessible boardwalk installed at South Beach. Works completed.

<u>Brittas Bay</u> – Accessible toilet, upgraded toilets, new larger water tank and new outdoor shower facilities. Car parking painting and tidy up. Works completed.

<u>Wicklow Town</u> –New outdoor showers, upgraded toilet facilities and path upgrading at Harbour area. Works commenced in June and are in progress.

<u>Arklow</u> – New boardwalk at South Beach, works commenced in June. Licence Agreement being finalised with Roadstone, landowner, with new facility works at the Cove to commence after the summer season.

### **Outdoor Recreation Infrastructure Scheme**

The Outdoor Recreation Infrastructure Scheme (ORIS) supports the development of new outdoor recreational infrastructure and the necessary repair, enhancement, or promotion of existing outdoor recreation infrastructure in countryside areas across Ireland. The Scheme is funded under "Our Rural Future" which specifically prioritises the growing outdoor activity tourism sector as part of a long-term vision for a vibrant and sustainable rural Ireland.

### ORIS funding for Measures 2 and 3 projects announced

On the 6<sup>th</sup> of June 2024, Minister for Rural and Community Development, Heather Humphreys TD, announced a €16.1 million investment in outdoor recreation projects right across the country. This funding will be invested in 69 larger scale outdoor recreation projects nationwide.

These projects under Measures 2 and 3 are to receive funding of up to €200,000 and €500,000 respectively and will be delivered by July 2026.

### **Public Lighting Energy Efficiency Project (PLEEP)**

The initial survey element of the above project has been completed. This is the initial phase of the project; the design is currently ongoing, and the retrofitting of lanterns will follow on in due course.

### **Periodic Speed Limits**

PWS Signs Ltd. has substantially completed the erection of the signage for the periodic speed limits at schools.

#### Speed Limits

New guidelines for managing speed limits have been announced. The initial proposal is for all local roads without an existing special speed limit in rural areas will be reduced from 80km/h to 60km/h, this is due to introduced in November with signage to be installed prior to that date.

#### **Noise Action Plan**

The Wicklow Noise Action Plan is currently being drafted and is due for public consultation shortly.

The public consultation for Dublin Agglomeration Noise Action Plan (NAP) has been completed. This plan includes the majority of Bray town.

### M11N11 Junction 4 to 14 Improvement Scheme

The Option Selection report was published along with Bulletin #11 on the project website www.n11m11.ie on 14 December 2021. The publication followed the review of submissions received during public display in 2021. Phase 3 Design and Environmental Evaluation was due to commence in Q1 2022. The scheme is currently suspended as no funding is provided. The Wicklow County Council project team are continuing to meet with the public and any interested parties.

### M11N11 Bus Priority Interim Scheme

The BPIS seeks to achieve the early delivery of bus priority measures in advance of the main scheme between Loughlinstown Roundabout and Junction 9 (Glenview). The scheme is currently at the Options Selection phase (Phase 2 of TII's Project Management Guidelines).

A non-statutory public display on the emerging preferred options for sections A and C took place in November 2022.

A further non-statutory public display event was held in the Glenview Hotel in September 2023 that presented the overall emerging preferred option for the BPIS between Loughlinstown Roundabout and Junction 9 (Glenview).

The public display documents are available to view on the project website www.n11m11bpis.ie.

A significant negative response was received during the public consultation to the proposed closure of the N11 access to the Herbert Road.

Further environmental studies and traffic analysis have been completed on elements of the emerging preferred option. As a result, further consideration is being given to the preferred options at J8 Kilmacanogue, J7 Bray south (including Herbert Road access) and J6 Fassaroe (including the R117 access).

### N11 Parallel Service Road at Kilmacanogue

A noise assessment to the east of the new Parallel Service Road Scheme was carried out during April and May 2022. The options review and design commenced in March 2023 following confirmation of funding from TII. Site investigation works were completed in November 2023. This information has been reviewed by the Design Team and the final design

option has been prepared. Direct consultation has taken place with the affected residents/landowners. The procurement of a contractor for the construction works is currently being progressed by the project team.

### **N81 Knockroe Bend Realignment**

Tenders for a Per-Cent Art Feature are being procured by the Arts Office. The preferred feature has been selected pending the completion of the final assessment stage.

### N81 Irishtown West, Whitestown Lower, Hangman's Bend and Tuckmill Lower "N81 Four Studies"

Following completion of Phase 1 feasibility studies (The N81 Four Studies – Feasibility Report), Wicklow County Council are now progressing the following two projects:

- N81 Whitestown Lower Project; and
- N81 Hangman's Bend and Tuckmill Project.

The Phase 2 Options Selection work is currently progressing under TII's Project Management Guidelines. A non-statutory Public Display event on the Route Options took place in the Inis Fail Germaines, Main Street, Baltinglass, on Wednesday 27th March 2024. The public display documents are available to view on the project website <a href="https://www.N81whitestownandtuckmill.ie">www.N81whitestownandtuckmill.ie</a>. The period for submissions ended on Friday 26th April 2024. The project team are currently compiling the submissions received for further consideration.

#### **N81 Pavement Capital Works**

Drainage works and the resurfacing of 1km of the N81 between Tuckmill and Saundersgrove were completed in May 2024. Two other sections of the N81 received surfacing renewal works namely at N81 Trooperstown Blessington and N81 Mullycagh Lower. Works were fully completed by end May 2024.

### N81 Hollywood Cross Rural Traffic Calming Road Safety Improvement Scheme (RSIS)

The Feasibility and Options report (Phase 2) was approved by TII in November 2023. The Design Report (Phase 3) was approved by TII in April 2024. The Part 8 statutory process (Phase 4) commenced on the 28<sup>th</sup> March 2024 with the period for submissions by interested parties ending on the 14<sup>th</sup> May 2024. At the May 2024 meeting of Baltinglass Municipal District the Elected Members voted to approve the Chief Executive's recommendation for the scheme to proceed. The Detailed Design and Contract Documents (Phase 5) will now be progressed.

### Park & Ride/Share at Hollywood

A feasibility report, funded by the Baltinglass Municipal District was prepared and submitted to TII in Oct 2021. This report considered an option for parking accessed from the N81. TII subsequently provided funding to further examine the feasibility and options.

TII have indicated that they do not support the proposed additional access to the N81. As a result, the option for a parking facility accessed from the N81 has been discounted from the traffic calming scheme. Suitable parking locations that can be accessed from the regional/local road network are being investigated.

### **N81 Blessington Gateway Project**

The Feasibility and Options report (Phase 2) was finalised and approved by TII in October 2023. TII have also approved funding to proceed with the design phase in accordance with TII Standards. Wicklow County Council are progressing this project to the design phase (Phase 3) to be followed by any necessary statutory approvals process (Phase 4).

#### N11/M11 Strategic Bus Park & Ride Facilities

Proposals for bus-based Park & Ride facilities are being progressed adjacent to the N11/M11 at Junctions 6 (Fassaroe), Junction 11 (Kilpedder) and Junction 16 (Ashford/Rathnew).

The Park & Ride at Junction 6 Fassaroe was approved by the Elected Members at the meeting of the full Council in November 2023.

The design for the Bus Park & Rides at Junction 11 (Kilpedder) and Junction 16 (Ashford/Rathnew) are being progressed in conjunction with the NTA Park & Ride Delivery Office.

### **Arklow Public Realm**

The Parade Ground Public Realm works are complete on site. Following a meeting with DoHLGH, Project Completion Reports were submitted with additional funding requested in December 2023. The OGP Inflation Payment has been agreed with the contractor with payment to be completed in June.

### **Arklow to Shillelagh Greenway**

We are in the final stages of Phase 2 Options Selection, which will determine the preferred route for the Greenway with landowner consultation ongoing. Following this, we will proceed to Phase 3, involving Design and Environmental Evaluation.

### **Baltinglass Town Centre Plan**

Enabling works started in Baltinglass in mid-February with the WCC Direct Labour crew completing site investigation works and have started utility works. The consultants are actively engaged in preparing documents for the delivery of a revised tender package for the town centre works, focusing on a reduced scope.

### **Blessington Inner Relief Road**

The current focus of the project is on the detailed design phase, including the preparation of associated documents such as the Compulsory Purchase Order (CPO) documentation. These efforts are crucial to advance the scheme towards obtaining statutory approval. Given the potential impact of the project on the Poulaphuca Special Protection Area (SPA), it is necessary to prepare a Natura Impact Statement (NIS) to assess and document any potential effects on the SPA. Once the detailed design and associated documents, including the NIS, are completed, the project will proceed to seek statutory approval from An Bord Pleanála.

### Wicklow County Council Compulsory Purchase (Chapel Road Pedestrian and Cycle Infrastructure Improvement Scheme) No. 1 Order 2021

The CPO Notice to Treat was issued on all landowners in October 2023. There is active engagement between Wicklow Roads Project staff and landowners who are part of the CPO, with landowner meetings taking place on November and December and January. Our project valuer is engaging with valuers and homeowners as part of the CPO process. Consultants are making steady progress in the detailed design phase and are currently focused on preparing the tender documents and drawings for the construction phase with these documents anticipated to be issued Q3 2024.

### **Wicklow Greystones Greenway**

Meetings and information sharing is ongoing with Irish Rail for their East Coast Rail Infrastructure Protection Project. Meeting with the National Parks and Wildlife Service (NPWS) took place in June 2023. The meeting provided an opportunity to engage with the NPWS and discuss important aspects related to the project. Greenway Project Consultant Atkins has issued a Constraints Report and a 4 week long public consultation period has recently been completed for the emerging route corridors. The project was presented at the April Council meeting with two public events taking place in Greystones and Wicklow during April.

### **Blessington eGreenway**

Under Section 177AE of the Planning and Development Act, we have formally submitted our planning documents to An Bord Pleanála. Given the need to conduct comprehensive additional surveys and generate a substantial volume of supporting material, An Bord Pleanála granted an extension to the submission deadline for additional information to January 29<sup>th</sup>, 2024. As this information has been deemed significant additional information by ABP we are required to undertake a public consultation period taking place in May and June 2024 for a 6 week period.

### **Active Travel Updates**

### **Projects under Construction**

#### **Ballyguilemore Active Travel Facilities (Wicklow MD)**

Provision of new pedestrian facilities and road safety improvements along the Ballyguilemore Road between Carrig View and the entrance to the proposed new St. Patricks GAA Pitch. The scheme includes for new footpaths and road widening works. Construction works are progressing well on site, with embankment construction works completed on the western side. Public lighting and drainage works are ongoing.

### **Arklow South Cycle and Pedestrian Scheme (Arklow MD)**

Provision of 2.8km of segregated cycle track along the R-772 Wexford Road, Arklow between Knockmore Roundabout and M11 Junction 21. The scheme will also construct 1.4km approx. of pedestrian footpath. Accommodation works are ongoing on the northbound carriageway. Preparation works have commenced for the slip form kerbing on the northbound carriageway.

### Safe Routes to Schools: St. Kevin's National School, Greystones (Greystones MD)

Provide infrastructure for schools to increase walking and cycling as the preferred travel mode where possible and improve safety at front of schools. Front of school implementation works are completed. Detail design being completed for the footpath connection from Church Lane. NTA approval has been received to move to construction stage. Consultation is ongoing with school and local residents.

### **Project Updates**

### **Bray Transport Interchange (Bray MD)**

New plaza and public transport interchange in front of Bray DART station, with revised car parking, set down and taxi rank arrangements. David Walsh Civil Engineering has commenced works on site.

David Walsh Civil Engineering commenced ground works in Mid-February. Works are ongoing on the installing the new drainage system for the project. Footpath works have commenced on Quinsborough Road.

### Wicklow Active Travel Pathfinder Project (Wicklow MD)

The project scope has been changed and will focus on the provision of high-quality pedestrian and cycle facilities along R750 from Wicklow Town Car Park and along Station Road. It will also include the provision of a new pedestrian and Cycle Bridge linking Station Road to Wicklow Town relief Road. Traffic surveys have been completed and work is ongoing on the preliminary design for the route.

### Wicklow Station Pedestrian and Cycle Link (Wicklow MD)

New pedestrian and cycle bridge to be provided at Wicklow Train Station, linking Station Road to the Port Access Road. Bus and vehicle set down to be provided along with cycle parking. Part 8 report being prepared for submission to the Council Members.

### **Greystones Active Travel - Pathfinder Project (Greystones MD)**

Provision of new and improved pedestrian and cycle links to Greystones Train Station. The spine route extends from Greystones Marina to Shoreline Sports Centre. The project will include improved pedestrian and cycle crossings along the Charlesland Dual Carriageway. Baseline assessment required by Department of Transport as part of Pathfinder. Tender to issue for contractor to carry out

and cyclist improvements on Charlesland Dual Carriageway. Preliminary Design of route from Greystones Marina to Shoreline Sports Park to be issued to NTA for approval.

#### Safe Routes to Schools: Scoil Nioclas Naofa, Dunlavin (Baltinglass MD)

Provide infrastructure for schools to increase walking and cycling as the preferred travel mode where possible and improve safety at front of schools. Presentation made to Baltinglass MD Members. Preliminary Design being finalised. Scheme will be advertised under Section 38 of Roads Act.

### Safe Routes to Schools: Gaelscoil na gCloch Liath, Greystones Educate Together & Temple Carrig School (Greystones MD)

Provide improvements on Blacklion Manor Road to make the area safer for school children. These works aim to encourage more children to walk and cycle to school. Preliminary Design is being prepared.

#### Kilcoole Road Footpath (Greystones MD)

Footpath to be constructed linking Greystones to Kilcoole. Meeting held with landowner to discuss accommodation works. A design has been prepared and issued to the landowner for agreement. Once the design is agreed a tender will be run to appoint a Contractor. It is hoped to begin construction in Q3 this year.

### **Bridge Rehabilitation (Local and Regional Roads)**

Work on 8 new bridges was completed in April/May.

Works "in-stream" will commence at 2 locations in the coming weeks at both Wicklow Gap and Sally Gap

#### **Winter Maintenance**

The changeover to brine has commenced with fleet upgrades. Remainder to be tendered.

### **Surface Dressing**

Chippings collection has been slow due to low quantities in tendered quarry. 2<sup>nd</sup> quarry used in part-emergency. Works to commence in next 2 weeks.

30 locations planned. 60 km of roadway in length.

The Vacant Property Refurbishment Grant is a payment you can get if you are turning a vacant house or building into your permanent home or a rental property. The grant applies to qualifying vacant properties in cities, towns, villages and rural parts of the country.

A grant of up to €70,000 is available.

If the refurbishment costs exceed the standard grant of up to €50,000, a top-up grant amount of up to €20,000 is available.

To qualify for the grant, applicants must:

- Have proof of ownership or evidence of active negotiations to buy the property (that is, confirmation of
  engagement from the estate agent or owner of the property) where you are seeking approval in principle for a
  grant.
- Live in the property as your principal private residence or make it available for rent.
- have proof that the property has been vacant for at least 2 years and that it was built up to and including 2007.

#### Operational Fire Statistics May 2024

There were **126 incidents** attended during the month of May 2024. Due to laid down procedures to mobilise two stations to potentially serious incident types, individual Fire Stations were mobilised on a total of **158 occasions** including **19** mobilisations in other counties. On no occasion did an incident commander request additional resources over what was prescribed in the Pre-Determined Attendance.

Operational activity for the month of May 2024 increased by 26% (+33 mobilisations) on the preceding month (April 2024: 125 mobilisations). There was an increase in mobilisations to domestic fires (+18), Road Traffic Collisions (+10), vehicle fires (+6), flooding (+5) and incidents in other counties (+9). There was a decrease in fires in other types of buildings (-11).

Operational activity for the month of May 2024 increased by 46% (+50 mobilisations) on the equivalent month in 2023 (May 2023, 108 mobilisations). Year on year there was an increase in mobilisations to RTCs (+16), incidents in other counties (+15), domestic fires (+7), vehicle fires (+5), flooding (+5).

14 new residential houses and 16 apartments were notified to LA for Commencement & 142 newly completed residential units plus 2 non-residential units were submitted, assessed and validated in May. There has been an increase in both Commencement Notice and Certificate of Compliance on Completion submissions compared to the same period in 2023. As speed of construction increases with seasonal changes, CCC submissions increased in May.

BER certificates for all newly completed units were requested & submitted to Building Control as per S.I. No. 243/2012 - European Union (Energy Performance of Buildings) Regulations 2012.

Building Control continued with site inspections in May to identify non-compliances with Building Regs onsite and 2 Section 11 Compliance Requests were issued.

Revised Information requests remained high in May for both Commencement Notices and Certificates of Compliance on Completion, 70% of Commencement Notice submissions & 53% of Certificate of Compliance on Completion submissions required revised information. The Temporary Waiver in respect of Development Contributions which led to the urgency in submitting Commencement Notices prior to April 2024 has been extended until December 2024. Building Control have observed numerous Commencement Notice Submissions that are currently 'Revised Information' status on BCMS and awaiting validation.

Opt Out submissions are both extensions and single unit dwellings, generally from BCMS users who are unfamiliar with both BCMS and Building Regulations which leads to Building Control resources being directed to resolving both administration and technical issues with Opt-Out Submissions. Wicklow Building Control continues to perform rigorous assessment of submissions at commencement stage and onsite presence during construction. These methods remain the best way to promote compliance with Building Regs.

BCMS was upgraded at the end of April and BC Users noted several software issues which had to be resolved with developers during the first half of May.

In May, BC Staff attended a CPD day Part C - Site Preparation and Resistance to Moisture hosted by NBC&MS Office in Limerick.

The lead in period to the Local and EU elections was a very busy period for the Franchise Section with over 3000 applications process through <a href="https://www.checktheregister.ie">www.checktheregister.ie</a> and in hard copy format. 2705 electors were added to the Balancing List Register. The national average turnout for the Local and EU elections was 49.4%. However, Wicklow polled 53.3% which was the largest turnout.



### **Information Systems**

### **Operations**

• The IT Helpdesk continues to streamline the workflow for the technical support team with an average of 50 tickets a day this month, providing assistance for both in-house and remote workers.

### **GIS & Systems Analysis**

- **Contour processing** from our DTM/DSM data for Waste Management. Processed contour data derived from our Digital Terrain Model (DTM) and Digital Surface Model (DSM) to improve waste management planning.
- Cleaned and uploaded Arklow Storm water network to the GIS system. Successfully cleaned and uploaded
  portions of the Arklow stormwater network data to the GIS system for Aklow MD's use. Further data cleansing
  is required to ensure accuracy and completeness of the dataset.
- **Updating missing Eircodes** from the Housing stock. The Housing department has requested assistance in updating missing Eircodes in their housing stock using the GeoDirectory Address fix tool.
- **Depot locations project**. Have collected most of the necessary data for the depot locations project. Final step involves processing this data and upload the depot locations and contact details to corporate GIS system.
- Wicklow Town-Rathnew Local Area Plan data extraction green spaces, field pasture, and unmanaged woodland. Converted Rathnew road options from AutoCAD to GIS format for better integration and analysis.
- Arklow & Environs Local Area Plan. Updates were made to the green infrastructure map as part of the Arklow & Environs Local Area Plan. These updates will support sustainable development and environmental conservation efforts.
- Barn Owl Database. Data from the Barn Owl Database was downloaded from the app and sent to relevant stakeholders. This data will contribute to ongoing research and conservation efforts for barn owls in Ireland.
- Upgraded ArcGIS Pro for Planning. Upgraded ArcGIS Pro for the Planning department and created a styling layer for all zoning codes. This enhancement will facilitate better visualisation and analysis of zoning information.
- Commenced development of an application for **Project Recording**. This application will streamline project management and collaboration across the organisation.

### Infrastructure
