The oath of ye Constables:

you & either of ye shall swear, yt. ye shall well & truly
serve ye King & his heirs: And ye Corporators & Burgesses of this town
and Burrough of ye Corporation of Wicklow in ye Office of
Constableness & Constables of this Town & Burrough for
duringe ye space of one whole year now next
ensuinge, you shall Endeavor yo selfe to ye utmost of ye
power, to see ye Kings Ma^{ties} peace kept and walth & ward
observed & kept in this Town and Burrough, as hath bene
accustomed, & as it ought to be; Likewise ye shall Endeavor
yo selfe to learn & understand the Contents of ye Statute
of Mortmaine: And likewise other Lawes & Statutes of this
Realm; made for ye punishment of Rogues, vagabonds and
sturdy Beggars; hauntinge & resortinge within ye limits
of ye Office; And punish ye offenders accordingly; Also
you shall punish all such games as doe or shall play At any
unlawfull Games; according to ye Statute in yt. Act made and
provided; you shall also have regard for ye Maintenance of
Artillerie within ye said Office ~~where~~ ye shall doe & accomplish
to ye utmost of ye power, for helpe ye God Giv.
